A word from Pastor Dave.....

On Sunday, September 12 we will return to our regular schedule after three good summer months. We started off the summer with an afternoon of looking at the various ministries of Kent called Renew - Revive - Rekindle and heard from 28 new members about why they chose to be members of our congregation. On Memorial Day we recognized the veterans of our armed forces with the Color Guard from the American Legion and heard a stirring rendition of "Taps."

In June we had the first of our "Bring A Guest" Sundays. All summer long we were blessed with visitors from all over the country, and even several families from England, Australia, and the Czech Republic. We had our first Cruise Worship in Gator's Restaurant Cove and talked about the significance of Mark's telling of the Easter story for the early Christians and for us today.

In July many volunteers from Kent helped make the annual Vacation Bible School fun and exciting for the children from the neighborhood, and Gerry Williams directed another successful Bible Camp with the help of Linda and Laura and volunteers from our Area 9 congregations. Our second Cruise Worship was held at Cartwright Springs Bay, and although a dog howled his disapproval of our singing we had a good time visiting and reflecting on Scripture.

In August we had the second "Bring A Guest" Sunday, and had the largest attendance of the summer at 180. We had a very successful rummage sale (\$3286) thanks to the leadership of Jan Ellis and a host of members. We enjoyed the 2nd Annual Social Ministry fundraiser (The Luau) and raised over \$8000 for those in need in our community. Many thanks to Evelyn Clements and her team of helpers for an evening of good food, fun and color.

Of course, every summer is highlighted by our outdoor worship services overlooking the Lake. What a delight it is to worship the Creator as we enjoy his Creation: "Praise the Lord earth and sky." Many thanks to Fred and Ken and all the ushers, greeters, altar guild, and others for all the extra work it takes to set up for that service.

But now it is time to return to our fall program, with Sunday School and Bible Class and that means more opportunities to **"Fix Your Eyes On Jesus."** After three months of summer, we are ready for a new year of learning and growing in Christ. 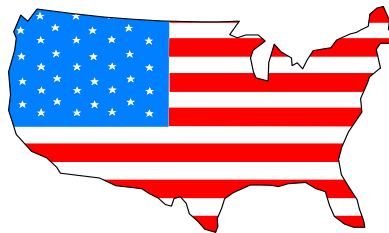

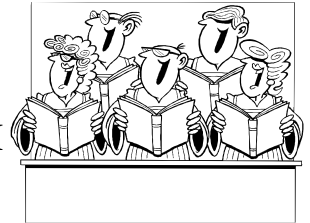

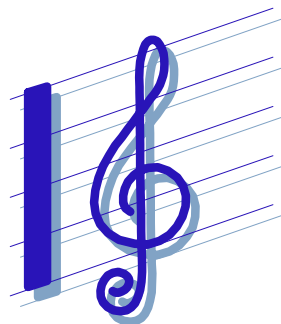

CLASSES FOR THE FALL

Begin on September 19 at 9:15 AM

Sunday Morning Classes

Primary Grades will be taught by LeeAnne Brumm and will focus on the Gospel reading from each Sunday. In our Gospel readings this fall we hear Jesus calling us to imitate creation. He bids us to accept the poverty of discipleship, to surrender to the way of repentance, and to walk in the paths of obedience.

7th and 8th Graders will begin the two year program of catechetical study by learning what Confirmation is all about and what it means to be a Lutheran Christian. The remaining weeks of year 1 will be spent on the sixty-six books of the Bible and their meaning for us today. Pastor Dave will be the guide.

High School Students will be led by Gail Kruse. They will be discussing a book by Max Lucado on John 3:16 and applying it to their daily lives.

Adults will be studying the *Book of Exodus*. Their leader for the journey out of Egypt will be Jerry Fitzhugh. Come and learn how God worked through Moses to set his people free.

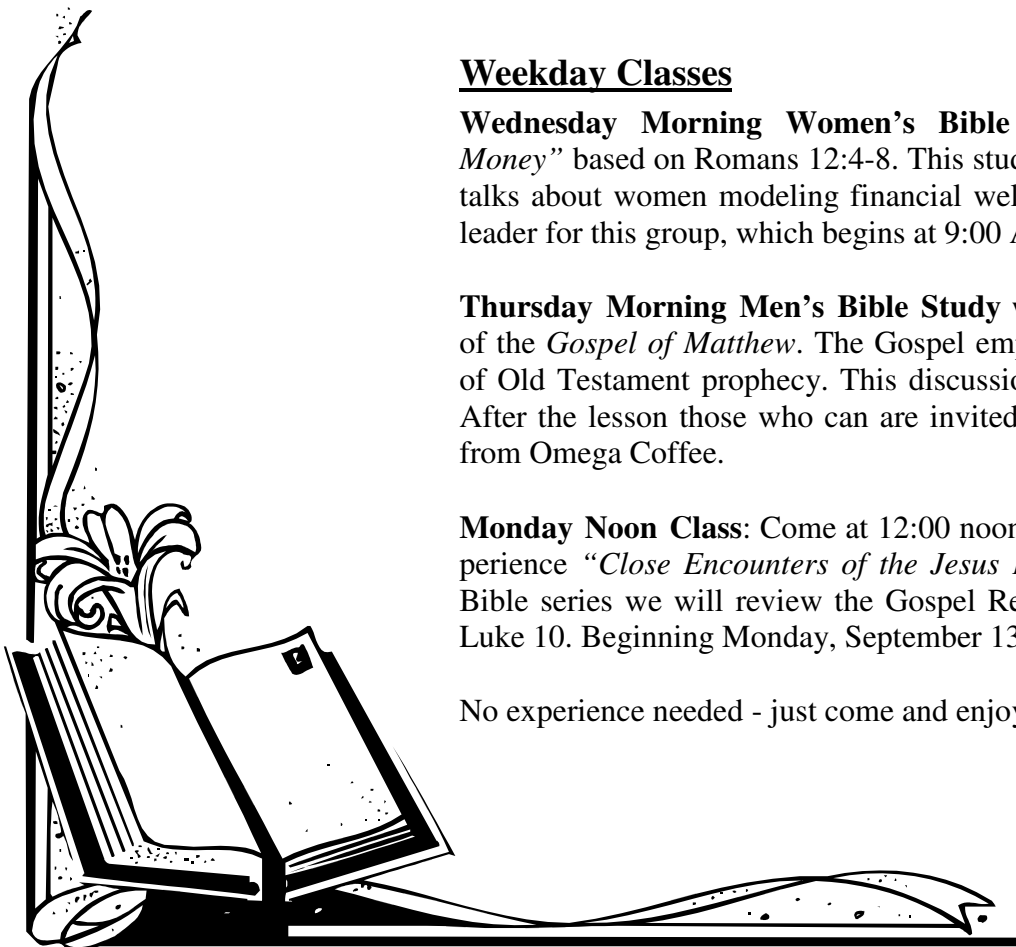
Weekday Classes

No experience needed - just come and enjoy Jesus and each other.



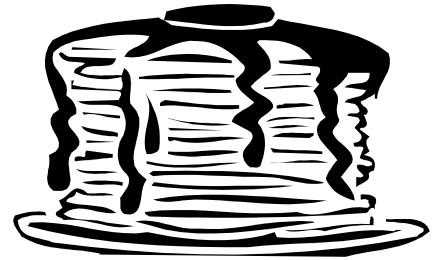
YOUTH GROUP

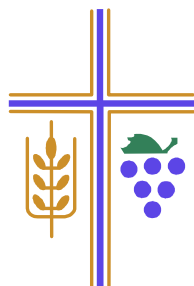

WHAT IS THE *FESTIVAL OF SHARING*?

The third Saturday of October is the day that people of faith, from many different denominations all over the state, gather at the Missouri State Fairgrounds, in Sedalia. The groups and families bring money that has been raised and “kits” that have been assembled during the year. Volunteers help to sack rice, beans and potatoes for distribution to Missouri agencies. In the afternoon state agencies bring their trucks and trailers to receive the kits, rice, beans and potatoes to distribute to their clients. Kits, assembled for Church World Service, are loaded on a semi-truck to continue their journey to other parts of the world.

The Festival is now in its 28th year and generates approximately \$1 million annually. This interfaith event is an expression of mission support and involvement that has helped improve the lives of countless individuals in Missouri and around the world.

PURPOSE AND MISSION

The *Festival of Sharing* seeks to:

1. Generate financial, material, and personnel resources for hunger, poverty, crisis, and injustice;
2. Meet and challenge injustice through advocacy and systemic change;
3. Promote awareness of hunger and justice issues, local and international outreach opportunities, and resource stewardship possibilities;
4. Encourage and enable hands-on experience with mission projects and local outreach agencies.

HOW CAN I HELP *Festival of Sharing*?

Festival of Sharing needs volunteers to help with the following positions:

1. Potato Drop—42,000 pounds of potatoes is a lot for one man to unload by hand. Give a hand and help.
2. Parking and Traffic—Show drivers where to park and help with traffic flow throughout the day.
3. Rice and Beans—Re-bag rice and beans to be distributed in the afternoon.
4. Welcome and Directions—Help people find their way.

Meeting called to order at 6:07 p.m.

Jennifer Bolton presented the devotion.

Motion by Ken Mueller to approve the minutes of the July meeting, second by Ken Gerardy, motion passed.

Motion by Don Peterson to approve the Treasurer's report as presented, second by Jerry Husbands, motion passed

Motion by Ken Mueller to approve the Building Fund report as presented, second by Bob Harger, motion passed

Pastor's report: Packie & Georgia McFarland, and John & Shirley Baremore have asked to be removed from the membership of Kent Memorial. Don Peterson, Pastor Beese and Jennifer Bolton will be members of a committee to review the membership list of Kent Memorial. Council members will review the minutes of the council meetings before they are published in the newsletter. Pastor Carl Gauck will receive the "usual and customary" pay of \$165 for 2 services on Sunday. Pastor Beese is no longer claiming mileage for reimbursement. LeeAnne Brumm has found it necessary to resign her position on council and the Stewardship Committee. Brad has a new job, and LeeAnne must be available to shuttle the children to their various activities. Pastor officiated at 10 worship services in July, made 13 visits to members and non-members, which included communion to 7 individuals; conducted 2 counseling sessions; attended 11 meetings, including council, Area 9 Pastors' meeting, 2 PMC meetings, Christian Ed, Social Ministry, Worship & Music, Evangelism, Altar Guild, Spiritual Coach and New Member Orientation; attended Men's Bible Breakfast and Sunday Morning Fellowship, and officiated at Jim & Diane Ziehl's 45th Wedding Anniversary Vows on July 31.

Christian Education report: There was no meeting this month, but the teachers are working on their rooms and supplies. Jerry Fitzhugh will teach the Adult Sunday Bible Study class beginning September 19th. Pastor Beese will continue his weekday Adult Class after Labor Day, and will be starting a confirmation class of 4 or 5 kids.

Evangelism report: Bring a Friend Sunday was August 8, and there are plans to have another in the fall. PMC's goal is to do more with kids in the community. The Kent Klowns will attend the Back-to-School fairs. Linda Williams is leading the Kent Klowns. The committee is seeking more slogans for use on the outdoor sign. Finance Committee: Work has begun on the 2011 budget. Committee chairpersons will be contacted to submit their budget requests by September 30th.

Long Range Planning: Kidwell Granite Works was contacted about the Gerschevske memorial stone and they found out that their selected stone has since been sold. They will go tomorrow to look at other stones. They will be talking about a pictorial directory for Kent Memorial at their next meeting. They expect to receive about \$1800 from the Stewart McFadden Fund for scholarships after January 1, 2011.

Property report: They met 8/14, followed by a work day. They have an estimate to install a permanent roof over the outdoor keyboard platform; work will begin after Labor Day. A letter was received from Unity at the Lake Church with a check for \$339 for the Social Ministry Committee, as they have no committee of their own. An invitation was received from Lutheran Family & Children's Services to attend their Luncheon & Open House on August 24 at noon. Ticket sales are going well for the Luau. Dental kits are being gathered for the Festival of Sharing. The initial fund amount of \$7402.70 for the Darleen Mueller fund has been invested with the Lutheran Community Foundation.

Stewardship: No meeting

Worship & Music: 3 Sundays remain for outdoor worship services. Attendance appears to be down 35-40 per Sunday, with the average about 147. Kathy Spaulding (Altar Guild) is checking on prices for a chalice, ciborium, paten & candleholder to be purchased with the balance of the Dick Peterson memorial money. Altar Guild is seeking more members, and they are planning an orientation session for those interested. Pat Poretta is coordinating food for the October 17th concert. The piano will be tuned prior to the event. Dehumidifier bars will be installed on the pianos in the sanctuary and choir room, at a cost of about \$150 each.

Youth: Kids Club begins the third Wednesday in September. The pancake breakfast, held between services on September 12, is a fundraiser, with the proceeds divided between the Youth Committee (for the New Orleans trip) and the Kids Club. September 12 is Youth Sunday; the Youth will be in charge of the worship service.

Partnership for a Missional Church (PMC): They are focusing on youth in the community. Some of their members attended the Morgan County and Camden County Back-to-School fairs. They distributed flyers on Kids Club at the fairs. PMC is taking lunch to the teachers at Hurricane Deck Elementary School this week.

Old Business: There are 11 names on the list of members to be contacted to see if they would be willing to be on council – 3 regular positions must be filled, and the balance of LeeAnne Brumm's term must be filled, which expires on 12/31/12.

New Business: Committees are reminded to have their annual reports ready for the February Congregational meeting. A new signature card has been signed for the Safe Deposit Box. Gail Kruse, Jennifer Bolton, Michael Wagner and Ken Gerardy will sign a new signature card for the general fund checking account at First National Bank. The signature cards for the two will now match. The large copier will need to be replaced in the not-too-distant future. The cost is approximately \$16,000, but if we traded in our current copiers, it would be \$5,000. Pastor has received positive responses to his "E-Kent" emails.

A thank you note was received from the Pregnancy Help Center – we raised \$350 in our "Baby Bottle" Campaign.

A motion to adjourn was made by Don Peterson, second by Chuck Wanamaker. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m., followed by The Lord's Prayer.
