

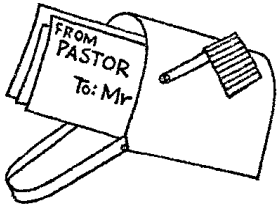

"While Shepherds Watched" considers, week by week, the great biblical shepherds who led, in their way, to the miracle of Jesus' birth:

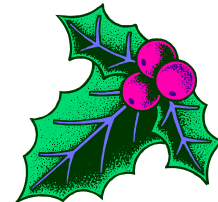

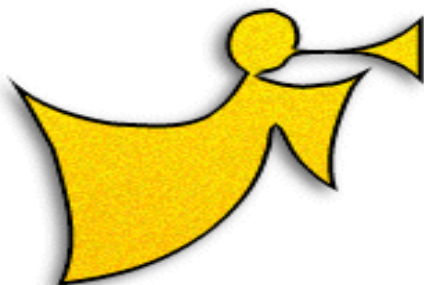
Join us for these Advent services and suppers as we get into the spirit of the season. Advent and Christmas Eve offerings will help support Kent's General Fund.

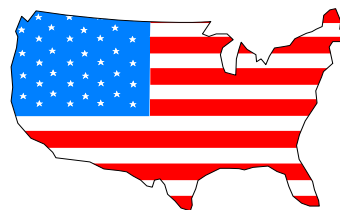

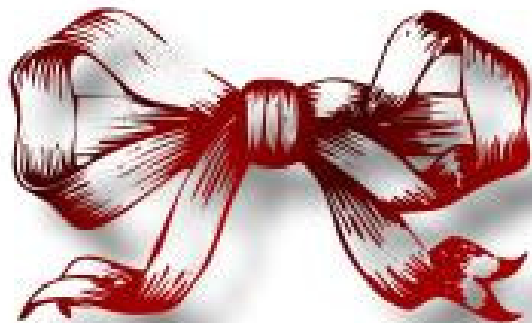

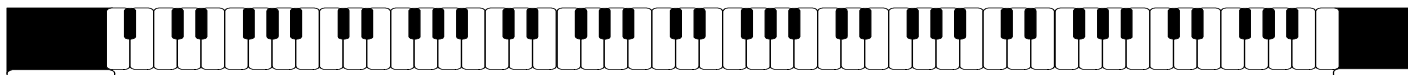
