



#### CHURCH COUNCIL

#### **Unapproved Council Minutes - December 11, 2012**

In attendance: David Curchy, Chuck Wanamaker, Jerry Husbands, Margo Strothmann, Pat Larson, Sheryl Boos, Linda Kimberling, Pastor Beese, Bud Kidder, Gail Kruse, Barb Yount and Michael Wagner. Absent: Don Johnson. New council members in attendance: Brian Kuckler and Bill Blomberg.

Meeting called to order at 6:31 p.m.

Pastor Beese led the devotion.

Michael Wagner thanked the outgoing council members: Linda Kimberling, Jerry Husbands and Chuck Wanamaker (Michael is an outgoing council member, as well).

Michael Wagner welcomed the new council members and thanked them for agreeing to serve.

Motion by Gail Kruse to approve the minutes from the November 20, 2012 meeting as presented, second by Jerry Husbands, motion carried.

Motion by Barb Yount to approve the Treasure's report as presented, second by Bud Kidder, motion carried.

Building fund report not received, tabled to the next meeting.

Pastor's report: \*Pastor Beese thanked the outgoing council members and recording secretary for their service to Kent. \*During Advent, our donut money from coffee fellowship, and dessert money received at the Advent dinners will go toward paying Campus Ministry Pastors, as their funding has been reduced due to budget cuts in the ELCA. \*Pastor praised Kent Memorial for their continued ministry to the community.

Available committee reports were presented. \*Social Ministry received an unexpected \$30 donation. \*Property: The furnace repair saga continues, but to date 3 of the furnaces beneath the sanctuary are now functional, with work continuing on our remaining units. Bill Blomberg reports that we are getting close to having fully functional heating throughout the church.

Old Business: \*Annual Committee reports are due to Tracy before January 15. \*Eldeen Hanke reports that the Styrofoam cups we use during our coffee fellowship are of the type that can be recycled, and she would like to see KMLC be more active in recycling efforts.

New Business: Election of 2013 council officers: Barb Yount nominated David Curchy for the position of Council President, hearing no other nominations, and David accepting the nomination, he was elected by acclamation to the position of President. Bud Kidder nominated Sheryl Boos for the position of Vice President, hearing no other nominations, and Sheryl accepting the nomination, she was elected by acclamation to the position of Vice President. The members currently holding the positions of Treasurer, Financial Secretary and Building Fund Secretary have been contacted and indicated their willingness to continue in their positions for the 2013 year. Motion by Jerry Husbands to retain those members in their positions, second by Sheryl Boos, motion carried. Council will need to appoint a new recording secretary. \*Committee assignments for 2013: David Curchy will be the council representative for the Ministry Fund Committee, Michael will check with Andrew Renken to see if he would be the Finance and Stewardship representative. \*Motion by Gail Kruse to give the paid staff \$50 Christmas bonus (same as past years), second by David Curchy, motion carried. \*Motion by Barb Yount to designate our \$4674 in ThriventChoice dollars to the general fund, possibly to use to purchase a new dishwasher for the kitchen, second by Gail Kruse. Following discussion, Barb Yount withdrew her motion, and no decision was made regarding the ThriventChoice dollars at this time.

No correspondence was received.

Next meeting January 15, 2013 at 6:00 p.m.

Motion by Linda Kimberling to adjourn, second by Gail Kruse, motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 7:17 p.m., followed by The Lord's Prayer.
