Greetings,

It's Autumn and this is the time of the year most congregations bring up the topic of stewardship. Say the word "stewardship" and most folks will turn their ear away and say "Don't talk to me about money." If you open up your Bible you will see that Jesus spoke more about our stewardship than any other topic.

We are all aware of the wild variety of schemes and programs being used by churches and evangelists to raise money. Some are quite obnoxious. While these techniques are ludicrous and well deserve the ridicule of the world, Christians must not shy away from calling on each other to return to the Lord offerings from that which God has given us.

When we Christians give an honest percentage of our wealth for the work of Christ's Church, we are doing a lot more than just paying the bills or erasing the cash flow deficit. We are confessing our faith in our Triune God.

Our offering is an act of worship to God our Father. When we return an offering of our income to God through our congregation we are stating that we believe God is the giver of all we have to provide us with all that we need to support this body and life. (Luther's Small Catechism – explanation of the First Article) Our offerings act out our relationship, our partnership with God and our agreement with God's Word that we cannot serve God and money.

Our offerings worship our Lord Jesus Christ. No material blessings from God can compare with the eternal joys which Christ won for us by his death and resurrection. It is the sacrifice of Christ which incites and empowers the sacrifice of ourselves to him. Our offering may not in itself be worth much, however, Christ, our Lord, accepts it and does great things with it.

Our offering is finally an act of worship to God the Holy Spirit. We who were dead in our sins, the Holy Spirit has made alive in Christ. The Spirit has gifted us with the wealth of all spiritual treasures. The faith we confess is itself the gracious gift of the Spirit. When we offer to the Lord the first-fruits of God's bounty to us, we do so to support the preaching and teaching of the Word here and throughout the world. We know that the Spirit blesses the Gospel proclamation which our offerings support. Supporting the work of the Church is, therefore, supporting the work of the Spirit. Our Triune God calls upon us to make a good confession of our faith with our offerings.

CHURCH COUNCIL

Unapproved Council Minutes - September 24, 2013

In Attendance: Don Johnson, Pastor Dave Beese, David Curchy, Bill Blomberg, Pat Larson, Barb Yount, Bud Kidder, Gail Kruse, Brian Kuckler, and Sheryl Boos.

Absent: Andrew Renken, Gary Esbeck, and Margo Strothmann.

Meeting called to order at 6:01 p.m.

Dwelling in the Word: Pastor Dave read an article from The Lutheran (September issue) about a congregation's outreach to an outsider and how it worked in their congregational life. He then led us in prayer.

Motion to approve the August minutes was made by Barb Yount, seconded by Gail Kruse.

Treasurers Report: We reviewed the report. Bill Blomberg made a motion to approve the report, Brian Kuckler seconded the motion.

Pastor's report: Pastor Dave shared details about the MT9 meeting that had just been held at Kent this last Saturday. 7 congregations attended and shared their experiences of what they had accomplished, how it had turned out, and their personal reflections of the Missional Process so far. He told us that Kent and Cole Camp are part of the teaching/sharing to the Area 9 group. He then gave us 2 questions:

What do we know now about who holds the memories/history of our church?

What are the gifts of the spirit that are reflected in our timeline?

*He talked about how September has been busy. We were reminded that the Renew, Revive, Rekindle event will be this Sunday (9/29) with a brunch potluck after second service. It will introduce the new members since last year and give them information about what Kent does through its committee work.

Old Business: * We are still looking at insurance – October will be the time this takes place and bid quotes are due. *The tree removal is scheduled (weather permitting) for the first week in October. The cut wood will be taken by a Tree Ministry from Camdenton and the stump removal will follow in a week or two. * The church service time was discussed at length, and decided that many from the congregation wanted to just go ahead with the change instead of waiting until next year. Starting Nov 1, 2013, the new times will be: 8:30 Sunday School & Adult Bible Study; 9:30 Worship Service; Coffee Hour after Service. 2014 Schedule will be: 8:00 a.m. & 10:00 a.m. services – Beginning Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day Weekend; 9:30 Service – Weekend after Labor Day – Weekend before Memorial Day. Motion Made by Barb Yount to follow this schedule, seconded by Pat Larson. All agreed. * We have 4 council members leaving the end of 2013: Gail Kruse, Bud Kidder, Don Johnson, and Dave Curchy. They will be seeking new members for their committees for their replacement. * Budget requests are being submitted for approval from committees. * The Boy Scouts were here tonight for their meeting. Pastor said this is working out well for them.

New Business: Advent Services Schedules will be distributed to the chairs for their dates to help with the advent meals.

Correspondence: * Letter from the Synod on new Bishop's installation and a donation form. * Letter from the ELCA office on "Lutheran Stickers" for our cars to display and how to order them.

Motion to adjourn was made by Bud Kidder, seconded by Bill Blomberg.

Then in 2014 and going forward, we will hold two services during the summer, Memorial Day through Labor Day, with the 8:00 a.m. service outdoors in the Ireland Chapel. The remainder of the year, we will worship together at 9:30 a.m.
