

REPORT ON THE CENTRAL STATES SYNOD GATHERING

FEAR AND HOPE: LIVING AT GOD'S TABLE

Thanks for allowing Wendy and me to serve as delegates from Kent Memorial at the 2014 Central States Synod Convention. It was an interesting and informative three days. [For highlights and information on the assembly, visit http://www.css-elca.org/about/synod-assembly/.]

We thought we would share some of our observations from the assembly. We are in a time of change as we have a new Bishop. This was Bishop Gustafson's first time to lead the assembly. We appreciated that he set aside time to give us the opportunity to talk with other delegates and share the hopes and fears of our congregations.

Some of the common concerns included aging congregations and the desire to share the Word with more young adults and kids. Those congregations with young members talked about the extra challenge today as many kids are involved with things such as traveling sports teams and activities on Sundays and during the week which interfere with church attendance.

In visiting with other congregations it reminded us how much Kent does in our mission to "Share Jesus with All." We often take our work with the schools and teachers, hosting the Cub Scouts, the Kent Kids, the Clown ministry, Social Ministry, Community for Christ, Share the Harvest, and our support in the community, for granted.

The Synod continues to address financial conditions. Giving was down a little and the Synod had to address the unbudgeted cost of the transition to a new Bishop. This included severance pay as well as moving costs. The new budget sets aside money each year so that future changes would be covered. The Synod has also moved to new offices which resulted in reduced rent.

In the good news department, this seemed to be a fairly tame assembly. This allowed us to concentrate on The Good News. There were no big or confrontational issues or resolutions. We don't believe that any congregation in the Synod left the ELCA this year. While we continue to have concerns we came away with a feeling of stability.

One of the Pastors relayed a conversation he recently had with a woman in a church in Western Kansas. Western Kansas is going through one of its driest years ever. When he noted that this year's drought must be very concerning, Dorothy said "It's been dry before." Strong and simple words to remind us that God has carried us through these places in the past and we can rely on God for the future.

This letter is to convey one message: *Thank you*.

That you for your generosity in providing your congregation's mission support to the ministries of the Central States Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Because of you, this Church has a strong, positive, and tangible impact on God's creation.

Because of you:

- Dozens of new congregations and Synodically Authorized Worshiping Communities are started every year. This means that people who have never heard for themselves Jesus' message of unconditional love are hearing it for the first time.
 Hillside Community Lutheran Church in Spring Hill, Kansas; Partner's Church in Wichita, Kansas; The Bridge in St. Louis, Missouri; and Living Waters in South St. Louis, Missouri, are examples here in our own synod.
- + Youth and young adult ministries are expanded, including, for example the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program, which invites and sponsors ELCA young adults ages 19-29 into a year-long journey in international service.
- + More than 200 missionaries are sent into the world, bearing the Gospel of Christ.
- + New church leaders are recruited, prepared, and supported so that the church of tomorrow as well as the church of today has pastors and Associates in Ministry who are more concerned with doing ministry than with paying off school debt.

We live in a time that is overflowing with opportunity to do God's work with our hands, to live out God's love in very practical ways. That's what mission support accomplishes: 50 percent of your offering promotes God's work in our synod, and 50 percent fuels our national and international ministries. Because of you, lives are touched, enriched, and blessed by the Gospel that brings us into eternal life. Thank you so much for your faithfulness.

God's work. Our hands.

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! I'm writing about an important conversation that I need your help to facilitate across our church. Your help in communicating this matter in your synod will be vital to our success.

At the ELCA Conference of Bishops meeting in February, we spent considerable time discussing who is welcome and invited to receive Holy Communion in ELCA congregations. While all people are welcome to worship, the recommended practice in our church has been that people who are baptized are invited to receive Holy Communion. Despite what our statement on the practice of word and sacrament, *The Use of the Means of Grace*, says, there is wide variety of practice in this church. You may recall that the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly approved an action designed to call ELCA members into a conversation about *The Use of the Means of Grace*, particularly on the matter of Holy Communion. The action came as a memorial from the ELCA Northern Illinois Synod.

Following the discussion in February and in conversations with other colleagues in this church, the ELCA Church Council approved the recommendation that we find ways to engage the entire church in conversation about this important matter before determining if there is need to open *The Use of the Means of Grace* for possible revision. The recommendation also suggests that this matter not be studied in isolation from the rest of the statement, but rather we take this opportunity to encourage a renewed study of and conversation about *The Use of the Means of Grace* in our congregations.

The churchwide organization's Worship and Marketing Communications teams are working together to provide resources to guide this church's conversation. Diverse perspectives, offered by Lutheran authors, will be available at www.ELCA.org/worship by mid-August, along with the *The Use of the Means of Grace* itself, a forthcoming study guide and other resources. Information about how thoughts, ideas and concerns can be shared with the Worship staff will also be available on this web page. The feedback we receive will be critical for determining future plans.

Although the study resources won't be posted until mid-August, it is crucial that we encourage pastors, other leaders and congregations as soon as possible to engage this important topic and to get it on their calendars now for the coming program year.

Will you help plant the seed for this important conversation among congregations in your synod today? Here are a few suggestions of what you might do right away:

- Publicize it. Through whatever vehicles of communication you have available in your synod, include notices
 about this and encourage conversations to be scheduled at conference or other clergy gatherings, congregational adult forums, worship committee meetings, and other venues throughout the coming program year. Include
 the centrality of word and sacrament to Lutheran identity in conversations within your synod.
- Widen the dialogue. Communion practices in this church in individual synods or individual congregations do not happen in a vacuum. I ask you to also be in conversation with your global companion synod, your domestic partner synod and with full communion partners and include their insights and concerns in your feedback.
- **Encourage study.** These conversations may be as brief as one hour or, especially if the encouragement to study this one concern within the context of the entire is taken seriously, they may extend over numerous weeks. The forthcoming leader materials will be adaptable for varied use.
- Encourage feedback. Encourage anyone embracing this project to take a few minutes to offer feedback. A
 place to offer feedback will be available at www.ELCA.org/worship in mid-August.

Thank you for your faithful service, and for the ways you will help members of this church to study and discuss together *The Use of the Means of Grace* and prayerfully consider the question of whom we invite and welcome to receive Holy Communion.

FOCUS ON...

EVANGELISM

Evangelism Committee assists the Pastor and Church Council with a multitude of ministries that serve the various needs of our community as well as social needs of our congregation. Among these are:

<u>Homemade Bread and Literature to be given to First Time Visitors</u> – Keep track of bread availability and ask ladies of the church to sign up to bake loaves for each Sunday. Ushers will hand out as Pastor requests visitors to stand and be recognized. First time visitors are also given a handmade wooden cross.

<u>Serve Coffee, Donuts and Sugar-free cookies after Sunday AM Service(s)</u> – Responsible for ordering donuts and keep track that sign-up sheets have weekly volunteers to prepare and set out coffee and donuts during the fellowship time.

<u>Host Receptions for 25th, 50th, 60th, 70th Wedding Anniversaries & 90th Birthdays</u> – Contact couples on the list of special anniversaries, and ask if they would like to have the celebration & what colors for their cake that will be ordered and served by the committee. Pick up cake and set up tables, etc., on Saturday for celebration on Sunday after main Service.

<u>Wednesday Evening Lenten and Advent Suppers</u> – This committee serves with one or two other committees to prepare & serve one meal for each of these seasons. The committees' date to serve is assigned by the Church Council.

<u>Blood Drive</u> – Hosted in connection with the Community Blood Bank three times each year in the Fellowship Hall in February, June and October, at which we serve cookies and juice.

Kent Klown Ministry's Budget connected to ours and reported monthly on activities.

Portable Road Sign – Posting events monthly or weekly as required for events.

<u>Photo Moments, Web Page & Newspaper Ads</u> – Kept current of events with announcements, pictures and new members pictures for Church Directory.

Renew, Revive, Rekindle and New Members – New members invited via post-cards & asked to share about their families; and announcements of duties given by Kent Committees along with church Potluck.

<u>Visitor Follow-up</u> – with cards or calls to Kent visitors by Karen Pragman.

Member Location Map & Chart - Keep names and pins current.

<u>Distribute 5x7 Flyers</u> – to businesses & resorts in May; Tracy updates flyer annually.

<u>Guess Who's Coming to Dinner</u> – Several homes hosting 6-10 people of our congregation for "Get Acquainted Dinner", usually in August or September.

<u>Provide a Social Opportunity for the Church</u> – Plan and organize Branson bus trips in the Fall to see Musicals such as "Noah's Ark", "Joseph" and "Jonah", and group tickets to the Main Street Opry at Christmas time.

<u>Provide Handouts for "Trunk or Treat"</u> – Organize this fun evening in October in church parking lot to hand out pencils and candy and a welcome to children in the neighborhood. Open to anyone who would like to participate and may wear costumes and decorate trunk of your car if you like (but not necessary).

<u>Christmas Goodie Sacks for Sunday School Children</u> – Join the committee to make up goodie sacks with an apple, orange, candy cane and small gift, and also gift from the Altar Guild which is usually put in the same bags to hand out to the children at their Sunday School Christmas Program.

Unapproved minutes of WELCA Meeting on June 3, 2014

President Kathy Fair called the meeting to order with prayer. She welcomed those present and thanked hostesses Marilyn Peterson and Shirley Clark. Glenice Gibson shared two different selections for our devotions.

Secretary Janet Harger was unable to attend the meeting so Kathy read the minutes of the previous meeting. There were no corrections or additions and the minutes were approved as presented. There were thank you notes from Community for Christ and Lake Regional Hospital Auxiliary. There was also a note of thanks and a check for \$75.00 from Gladys Bohling for the lunch served after Verlyn's funeral. The notes will be posted on the WELCA bulletin board.

The Treasurer's report was presented. There were no questions on the report and it was approved as presented.

Standing Committee reports -

<u>Christian Action</u> There were 14 ladies stuffing critters. 62 critters were stuffed and sent home to be closed. 50 critters were sent home to be sewn, trimmed, turned and pressed. 50 critters have been sent home to have faces drawn. 62 critters have already been delivered to the hospital for the month of June. 10 sets of hats and booties have been completed and are ready to be delivered to the hospital. 
