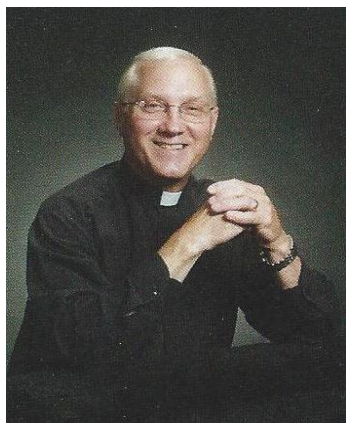

It has now been 12 years since the **“Beginning The Next Fifty Years”** Building Fund Program. Those first years were busy years as you planned for and completed the expansion of the sanctuary and the fellowship hall. What a time that was and what a grand celebration when the building was dedicated.

The next three year pledge drive was entitled **“Overflowing With Blessings and Thanksgiving!”** and all of us continued to pay down the debt as we thanked God for the blessing of a new sanctuary and fellowship hall to carry on the mission and ministry which God had given us. How thankful we are for the blessings of God’s grace, committed people, new faces and a beautiful facility in which to worship and fellowship and serve.

The following three year pledge drive was in 2009 and the theme was **“Blessed To Be A Blessing.”** It reminded us that just as God had blessed us, so we too needed to be a blessing to the community in which we serve and to the world God loves.

In 2012 we began our 4th campaign to further pay off the debt and we named that fund raising time **“Catch The Vision! Share The Glory.”** It was named after a hymn by Jaroslav Vajda who wrote these words in 1991:

*For this time and place we have been born. Gifted by the Spirit, trained and sent:
With the eyes of Jesus seeing. With the hands of Jesus helping.
With the words of Jesus bringing life. Catch the Vision! Share the Glory!
Show the captives, tell them Christ is here!*

Now we come to that time when we need once again to renew our commitment for the next three years and I trust that we will continue to move forward and complete the task. As we begin the last three years of our campaign to pay off the mortgage, I am reminded of the words of Larry the Cable-Guy: **“Git ‘R Done!”**

We have said it before, “If we all pull together we will get it done.” That’s what it means to be the Body Of Christ here at Kent. When there is something that needs to get done we join together to get it done.

And what a job we have done! And not just us, but the many people since 2004 who have since died or moved away. They all blessed this congregation with loving hearts and deep pockets. Our original loan from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund in May, 2004, was \$650,000; that was after an initial fund drive for the down payment. As of July 1, 2015, our debt is down to \$124, 817.

But let’s not take the credit for what has been done these last 12 years. *“Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain.”* We have a beautiful house of worship to praise and glorify our gracious Lord and a great place to gather for meetings, potlucks, dinners, entertainment, and to allow the community to use.

We thank God for giving us the means to pay for it. All that we have comes to us from the Lord. God has given us a work to do and the hands to do it. Our mission is to proclaim the wonderful deeds of God and then with our hands practice what we proclaim. Our facilities serve as a means to serve the Lord and accomplish God’s mission.

OUR THEME THEN FOR THESE LAST 3 YEARS WILL BE THE MOTTO OF THE ELCA: “GOD’S WORK – OUR HANDS!” Let’s all pull together to finish the task before us and continue being God’s hands to love and care for his creation. See the back page for your pledge card to be handed in September 6.

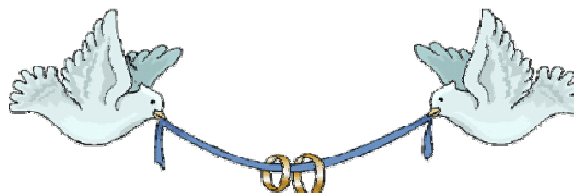

Meeting called to order at 5:59 p.m. by President Jim Mellody.

Dwelling in the Word: Pastor read from the Lutheran Magazine a devotion by Peter W. Marty entitled "Mercy".

Minutes- Amend June minutes to read, "Discussion on what to do with the William & Jeri Hunter Trust funds. Andrew Renken made a motion to transfer trust funds to Mission Investments. Eldeen Hanke seconded the motion and all approved." Motion to approve amended minutes was made by Andrew Renken, seconded by Gail Kruse. All approved.

Treasures Report- We reviewed the report given by Gail Kruse. A motion was made to approve the June report by Bill Blomberg, seconded by Joyce Wanamaker. All Approved.

Carpet cleaning estimates will be gathered for after the rummage sale.

New Business- Central States Synod is requesting a special donation of \$500.00. Pastor recommended we use \$2500.00 of the Hunter Trust fund to help out. Brian Kuckler made a motion to make the donation of \$2500.00 to the Central States Synod. Mark Kelly seconded and all approved. Discussion was had on the security of the Church. Need to get an estimate on rekeying the church. We will revisit the issue at a later time.

Correspondence- Two thank you notes received and read from Community for Christ, and a thank you from CADV.

Motion to adjourn was made by Joyce Wanamaker, seconded by Mark Kelly. All approved.



Evelyn Clements passed a sign-up sheet to volunteer at Community for Christ.

The Laurie Care Center will hold the quarterly volunteer planning meeting on July 9.

Karen Mellody reported \$815.09 earned from the sale of Scrip cards. Those who order online may receive emails regarding special offers.

Kent Klowns will entertain at Praise in the Park on July 12. Joyce Wanamaker made a beautiful quilted wall hanging for the clowns to use in their Front Door Fairy skit.

The Sunshine Lady sent one get well and 1 sympathy card in June.

The Care Core coordinator for July is Eldeen Hanke.

Wendy reported collection of 33 Campbell soup labels for year-to-date total of 212 and 240 Box Tops for Education for total of 754.

Members were reminded to make crafts to be sold in Shirley's boutique at the rummage sale. Set up for the rummage sale is Thursday, July 30. The sale is July 31 and August 1. Sign up sheets are posted on the bulletin board.

Eldeen moved that proceeds from the rummage sale be divided 1/3 to the broader church, 1/3 to the local community, and 1/3 to Kent. This will be a permanent division with specific funds within the three categories selected each year. Joyce Wanamaker seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Sharon Ballard moved to donate \$125 to the Vacation Bible School. Melba Bangert seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Eldeen will investigate the cost to replace the vinyl tablecloths for the long tables. She also announced that there will be a going-away party on July 26 during the fellowship hour for Joe Marco who is reporting for the US Navy. There will also be birthday cards to sign for Helen Oldham's 90th birthday.

Kathy Fair challenged members to think of ways that Thrivent Action Teams can use \$250 grants for project supplies in conjunction with "God's Work. Our Hands" on September 13.

Members were reminded that Kent will host the West Lake Newcomers salad luncheon as a fundraiser on August 19.

Sheryl Boos and Barb Yount will be hostesses in August. Barb will give the devotion at the August 4 meeting. The meeting was adjourned with members sharing the Lord's Prayer.

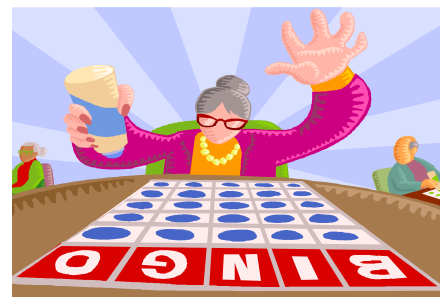
