Depend on the Weather??

“April showers bring May flowers.” So goes the old saying. But what if the weather doesn’t cooperate? We had an awful lot of flowers blooming in March when it was so warm. Then the temperatures plunged into the 20’s, killing virtually all the new growth. Although warmer temperatures have returned, as April is receding and May approaches it remains to be seen if we will have “May flowers.”

Whatever happens, and in spite of global warming, there will be seasons, days, months, years, times of growth and dormancy in the natural world. (Genesis 8:22) But even more dependable than the weather is the faithfulness of our God.

God is the One in whom we put our trust for good reason. God is the One who will never fail or change.. God is eternal. God created all things. God formed us and breathed on us the breath of life. Even in the midst of tragedy, as he viewed the destruction of his nation, his temple, his Jerusalem, Jeremiah could say, “The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; God’s mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.” (Lamentation 3:22-23)

Jesus, our Savior, the God who became human embodies this faithfulness. “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.” (Hebrews 13:8) “If we have died with Him, we will also live with Him; if we endure, we will also reign with Him; if we deny Him, He will also deny us; if we are faithless, He remains faithful - for He cannot deny Himself. (2 Timothy 2:11-13)

And as Jesus warned of the signs of the end times, He reminded the disciples (and us), “Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.”

We can also depend on the Holy Scriptures, as Jesus Himself did. “The Scriptures cannot be broken,” (John 10:35) and in His high priestly prayer, “Your Word is truth.” (John 17:17)

Circumstances change, people change, weather changes – it seems like everything changes. We can ultimately depend on no one and nothing. **BUT WE CAN DEPEND ON GOD**, whose love, power, and mercy will never change.

The Season of EASTER continues through the month of May. You may have noticed on April 23rd that we used the Thanksgiving of Baptism instead of Confession and Forgiveness. We will continue to use this Thanksgiving throughout the season of Easter. Because of its images of new life in the risen Christ it is fitting to use during this joyous season. The pastor begins at the baptismal font for the Thanksgiving. Water may be poured into the font as the prayer is said. As a reminder of the gift of baptism the congregation may be sprinkled with water as the Gathering hymn is sung. This sprinkling of the assembly is a reminder that, “By water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ.”

Easter is a reminder for us that Christ is with us – behind closed doors, in our doubt, on our journey, in water, bread and wine, the Good Shepherd calls us to follow, going before us to prepare the way, bringing peace, breathing the Spirit on us, so that we may tell this story to people of every land and nation. Jesus’ promise to be with us is always the game changer!!!

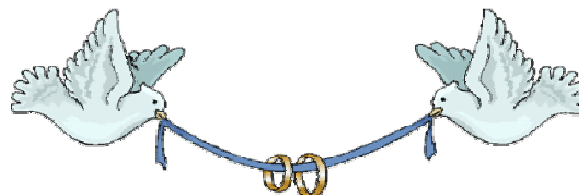

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

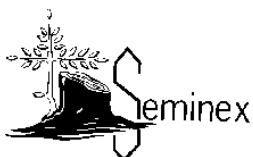

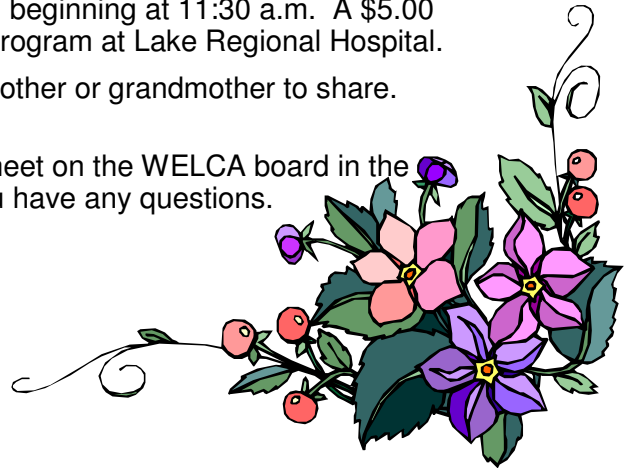

KENT CARE CORE MINISTRY

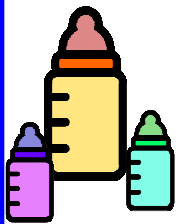

Long Range Planning Report 2017 Stewart McFaden Scholarships

The Long Range Planning Committee met on March 28th for the purpose of selecting the recipients for the scholarships for 2017 which are given by the Stewart McFaden Scholarship account. Present for the meeting were Karen Pragman, Don Peterson, Gloria Peterson, Jim Ziehl, Nancy Beese and Pastor Dave.

This scholarship was established by Clifford Stewart, a former member of Kent Memorial and honoring his mother Mildred McFaden. Near the end of his life he designated his entire estate to a scholarship fund placed with the ELCA Foundation to be used for graduating seniors based on their needs and goals. The first scholarship was awarded in 2011. We are sure Mr. Stewart would be very pleased with the way his wishes have helped and enabled students to continue their education.

In accordance with the will of Clifford Stewart, we will begin receiving in 2017 earnings of 50% from the ELCA Foundation Fund. This allowed us to have a total of \$4,000 to use in scholarships. There were no members of Kent Memorial in the graduation class this year. There were eight applicants from the Camdenton School District, six applicants from Versailles, and one from Lake Christian Academy. Three \$1,000 scholarships and two \$500 scholarships were awarded this year.

A reception will be held at Kent after the service on April 30th honoring these recipients. Cake and punch will be served. Invitations have been sent to each student receiving a scholarship.
