REFORMATION 500

When Martin Luther hammered his 95 Thesis to the door of the Castle Church on All Saints Eve (October 31, 1517) in the small university town of Wittenberg, Germany, one could say that its sound would reverberate across Europe and, eventually the globe. Soon, these declarations from Luther's pen would go to print not only in Latin, the professional language of churchmen and academics, but also in the language of the common folk with revolutionary results.

These 95 Thesis were written to criticize abuses of church power, especially the pope's attempts to raise funds for renovating St. Peter's Basilica in Rome by guaranteeing salvation to all who would simply donate to the building project. "As soon as the coin in the coffer rings, the soul from purgatory springs," preached John Tetzel, a famed seller of the pope's indulgences as he made his way throughout Germany.

In the 95 Thesis Luther strongly denounced such cheapening of God's grace, which distorted and watered down the message of salvation merely to collect money from the peasants. Luther insisted that the Christian life should be filled with repentance and that the "true treasure of the church is the most holy gospel of the glory and grace of God."

This October Christians throughout the world will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation that Luther started. Why do we celebrate?

Luther himself, who tended to see human effort not only as vain but also often as a joke, recognized that GOD ALONE could advance his cause. For this reason, he quipped that he had done nothing at all to make the Reformation succeed.

"I simply taught, preached, and wrote God's Word; otherwise I did nothing," Luther said. "And then, while I slept, or drank Wittenberg beer with my friends Philip Melanchthon and Nicolaus von Amsdorf, God's Word so greatly weakened the papacy that never a prince or emperor did such damage to it. I did nothing. The WORD did it all."

And perhaps, this is ultimately why we should celebrate Luther and the rest of the reformers, for they trusted Scripture to make an impact in their age. God's Word has continued to stick with us for centuries, resounding across the globe. Such was the core truth of the 16th century Reformation:

"God's Word forever shall abide, no thanks to foes who fear it; for God himself fights by our side with weapons of the spirit. Were they to take our house, goods, honor, child, or spouse, though life be wrenched away, they cannot win the day. The Kingdom's ours forever. Martin Luther, "A Mighty Fortress." Vs 4.




