

Pastor's Thoughts January 2020

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Melba Bangert.

**Dwelling in the Word:** Gerry Williams opened with devotion.

**Pastor's Report-** Pastor Gauck reported he had seven drop in's, conferences and visits, attended seven committee meetings/congregation wide meetings, three community/area ministry meetings and four worship services, one being at the Laurie Care Center. 
# **BRING IN THOSE BOX TOPS, UPC CODES & LABELS**

## **MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES AT KENT MEMORIAL**

Sign-up sheets for these and more are in the Fellowship Hall.

- Altar Guild Altar Guild is responsible for all things having to do with the worship space and its furnishings—sanctuary, altar, communion, Christmas decorating, etc. This committee works within Worship & Music. Altar Guild meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 9:30 a.m.
- **Bible Study** Bible study and fellowship each week for both women and men. Women meet on Wednesday mornings at 9:00 a.m.; Men's Fellowship gathers on Thursdays at 9:00 a.m.
- Community for Christ Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. during our scheduled weeks. Our first turn is January 19, 21 & 23. See Jim Mellody with questions.
- Evangelism This committee meets the first Monday of the month at 9:30 a.m. They help us serve various needs in our community as well as the social needs of our congregation, such as receptions, fellowship times, etc. They organize outings to plays and musicals for the members and lead the support for the nearly 200 children at Hurricane Deck Elementary School and South Elementary School for Buddy Packs, Trunk or Treat, Christmas goody bags, the Christmas Store, the annual Cake Walk, etc. Each week they oversee:
  - Coffee Host Volunteers are needed each Sunday to set up and clear away the goodies.
  - **Donut Pick-up** Pick up the donuts from G2M in Laurie on Sunday mornings for our coffee fellowship.
- **Kent Klowns** from leading worship to making children smile, this group's purpose is to Share Jesus With All. See Kathy Fair if you'd like to start clowning around.
- Laurie Care Center/Laurie Knolls needs vary, from serving ice cream to helping with BINGO. See Karen Mellody if you want to get involved.
- Long Range Planning this group currently helps administer the Stewart-McFaden Scholarship Fund, which provides college scholarships to deserving high school seniors. They also organize the church's pictorial directory. See Karen Pragman if you want more information.
- **Property Committee** These folks make sure the grounds and buildings are kept cleaned up and in good repair. See Curt Reams with questions.
- **Social Ministry** As our benevolence committee, this committee works to "Share Jesus With All" with a focus on outreach into the local community. See Jim Mellody if you're interested in helping.
- **Westside Senior Center** We help serve lunch Monday through Friday during our scheduled weeks, from 10:45 a.m.-1:00 p.m. See Joyce Wanamaker with questions.
- Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (WELCA) All women at Kent Memorial are members of this group and are brought together during the church year through many activities, such as making stuffed animals and hats and booties for the local hospital, the Annual Rummage Sale in August and the Annual Cookie/Candy/Bake Sale in December. The activities support organizations both within and outside of Kent. Meetings are the first Tuesday of each month.
- Worship & Music The committee, along with Altar Guild, assists the pastor and church council in assuring that the worship services at Kent are conducted regularly and in accordance with the liturgy of the ELCA. They also schedule guest concerts and performances at Kent. See Tracy Garrett, chair.
  - **Greeters** Greeters are the first impression our visitors get on Sunday morning as you welcome worshipers to Kent.
  - **Ushers** We need two ushers at every service on Sunday mornings. New volunteers can be paired with experienced ushers.
  - Choir The adult choir rehearses on Sunday mornings at 8:00a.m. They sing for worship every Sunday.
  - **Handbells** The handbell choir rehearses on Sunday mornings following worship, approximately 10:30 a.m. They play once per month and for festival services.
