Pastor's Thought February 2020

William Willimon, professor at Duke Divinity School, wrote in his 1992 book, *Peculiar Speech*, his remembering when a friend of his visited the Soviet Union in the 1970s. Upon his return he announced that the church behind the Iron Curtain was mostly "irrelevant because the only people there are little old ladies." Dr. Willimon writes, "Looking back now at the collapse of communism, the difficulties of rebuilding the Soviet Union after a long period of spiritual bankruptcy, I hope my friend would now say, 'Thank God for the little old ladies.' Their existence provided a continuing, visible, political rebuke to the Soviets."

I read constantly about many pastors who write about how old the membership of their congregation is and how it is mainly women and how with the Millennial's who are avoiding the church today. In many congregations in US they have only a few young people in them. I understand what they are saying but for me really I say thank God for those little old ladies. They are the ones who are often the witnesses for the church today. I constantly hear how God has been active in their life and they are often the ones who are the teachers of the lessons God has taught them. Sometimes it wasn't until later in their lives that they came to appreciate how God was there for them. Sometimes they would tell stories of their lives seeing their parents as witnesses to Christ and the Lord's presence during difficult times. Sometimes they would share how during the death of their parents or a loved one that they saw how peacefully they approached death for they trusted in Christ's promise.

So I say again how much I appreciate Kent's ladies for they have much to teach and they are so energized by their faith that they give freely of themselves to young and old alike. And they often fully get their spouses involved in varied ministries but the truth be told most of them are just as committed as their wives. Whatever may happen in the future of Kent one thing I am certain it will be a place where people witness to Christ in a needed variety of ways and for which their witness is truly visible here at Kent and in our community.

- A. Current Financial Situation** - The Finance Committee and Council continue to monitor giving and expenses monthly. - B. TD Ameritrade Account** - As you make distributions from your retirement IRAs or investments, please visit with your financial planner/accountant about the possibility of transferring some of those funds to the Kent TD Ameritrade account. The transfer might be able to be made with no capital gains tax consequence to you. Discussions surrounding the TD Ameritrade account have resulted in two contributions to date. If you have questions about this, please contact Gail Kruse or Al Mohling.
- C. Annual Thrivent Choice Dollar Designation** - Eligible members can recommend where Thrivent distributes a portion of its charitable funding by directing Choice Dollars®. Members become eligible for Thrivent Choice based on insurance premiums, contract values and Thrivent volunteer leadership. Log on now to the Thrivent website to direct your Choice Dollars to Kent Memorial. If you have questions about this, please contact Joyce Wanamaker, Kathy Fair, or Al Mohling.
- D. Thrivent Action Teams** – Thrivent provides \$250 per project to kick-start a fundraiser, educational event, or service project for Kent or the community. Unapproved Church Council Minutes, January 21, 2019

Meeting called to order at 5:58 p.m. by President Bill Work.

Dwelling in the Word: Kathy Fair opened with devotion.

Minutes- A motion to approve the December minutes was made by Mary Evans, seconded by Al Mohling, all approved. A motion to approve Special Council meeting January 8, 2020 was made by Michael Wagner, seconded by Al Mohling, all approved.

Treasurers Report- Gail Kruse presented the financial reports. Discussion about giving shortfall/expenses followed.

Pastor's Report- Pastor Gauck reported he made one hospital call, had eight drop in's, conferences and visits, attended five committee meetings/congregation wide meetings, three community/area ministry meetings and nine worship services. Lenten services will be held at Kent per congregational vote. Services are planned through Epiphany and plans for Lent are being finalized but will include a Seder Service on Maundy Thursday.

Committee Reports- Budget and Finance reported the counter schedule has been distributed to all those involved with counting offering. A short article will be added to the newsletter to inform the congregation about Choice and Action Dollars available through Thrivent and TD Ameritrade. Long Range Planning will be reviewing the Steward McFadden scholarship fund and the works of the program including Trustees. Stewardship is working on a plan that is based on an acronym and is not just about money. Property reported they had two truckloads of the leaves removed at the cost of \$200.00. In the future, given enough volunteers and favorable weather, leaves will be burned. Worship and Music reported Lenten Services will be held on Wednesday's with a shared potluck. On April 9th, Maundy Thursday they will serve a Seder meal. A Cantata by the Choir will replace our Good Friday Tenebrae Service.

Old Business- Discussion was held on the Church Vitality Survey. Katherine Lacroix made a motion seconded by Michael Wagner to go forward with the survey at the cost of \$100.00. The survey will be available to all members, including Snowbirds and Homebound. All approved. -Property indicated a longer lead time was required to react to inclement weather. The policy should be reviewed by Worship & Music/Property. In discussion, it was agreed that cancellation decisions should be made no later than Saturday night, rather than Sunday morning, providing additional time for the calling tree and/or snow removal.

New Business- Committee rosters were distributed for review and updating. Lent meal assignments were assigned. Ash Wednesday, no meal. Wednesday, March 4th Worship & Music Budget & Finance March 11th Alter Guild and Christian Ed., March 18th Property and Mutual Ministry, March 25th Evangelism, Social Ministry and Stewardship, April 1st Long Range Planning and Audit. Committee Members are responsible for set up and clean up. Everyone is invited to bring a dish to share. Annual Synod Assembly will be held June 4-6th at the Renaissance Hotel in St. Louis. The Theme is "God's Vitality Among Us: We are Church". It is requested that our congregation send two lay voting members, typically a man and a woman. If interested in attending Synod Assembly, contact Bill Work or any council member. Council members are to bring nominations to the February meeting.

Motion to adjourn was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Katherine Lacroix, all approved.

Meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

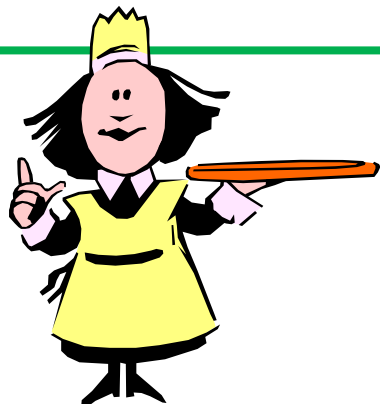
