Pastor's Thought March 2020

William Willimon, professor at Duke Divinity School, wrote in his 1992 book *Peculiar Speech*, his remembering when a friend of his visited the Soviet Union in the 1970s. Upon his return he announced that the church behind the Iron Curtain was mostly "irrelevant because the only people there are little old ladies." Dr. Willimon writes, "Looking back now at the collapse of communism, the difficulties of rebuilding the Soviet Union after a long period of spiritual bankruptcy, I hope my friend would now say, 'Thank God for the little old ladies.' Their existence provided a continuing, visible, political rebuke to the Soviets."

I read constantly about many pastors who write about how old the membership of their congregation is and how it is mainly women and how with the Millennial's, who are avoiding the church today, are struggling. In many congregations in US they have only a few young people in them. I understand what they are saying but for me I say thank God for those little old ladies. They are the ones who are often the witnesses for the church today. I constantly hear how God has been active in their life and they are often the ones who are the teachers of the lessons God has taught them. Sometimes it wasn't until later in their lives that they came to appreciate how God was there for them. Sometimes they would tell stories of their lives seeing their parents as witnesses to Christ and the Lord's presence during difficult times. Sometimes they would share how during the death of their parents or a love one that they saw how peacefully they approached death for they trusted in Christ's promise.

So I say again how much I appreciate Kent's ladies for they have much to teach all of us and they are so energized by their faith that they give freely of themselves to young and old alike. And they often fully get their spouses involved in varied ministries here as well but the truth be told most of their husbands are just as committed as they are. Whatever may happen in the future of Kent one thing I am certain it will be a place where people witness to Christ in a needed variety of ways and for which their witness is truly visible here at Kent and in our community.

Financial Notes:

- A. Current Financial Situation** - The Finance Committee and Council continue to monitor giving and expenses monthly. January was a good giving month due to two annual gifts. The cash balance is currently adequate for paying bills and salaries, and is also closely monitored. As communicated in the past few months, please prayerfully and cheerfully consider increasing your contributions and/or inviting friends and neighbors to Kent.
- B. Annual Thrivent Choice Dollar Designation** - Eligible members can recommend where Thrivent distributes a portion of its charitable funding by directing Choice Dollars®. Members become eligible for Thrivent Choice based on insurance premiums, contract values and Thrivent volunteer leadership. **Log on now to the Thrivent website to direct your Choice Dollars to Kent Memorial by March 31.** If you have questions about this, please contact Joyce Wanamaker, Kathy Fair, or Al Mohling.
- C. Thrivent Action Teams** – Thrivent provides \$250 per project to kick-start a fundraiser, educational event, or service project for Kent or the community. Each qualifying Thrivent member can submit two projects per year for approval by Thrivent. This is an excellent way to provide funds to do projects and not have to use Kent budgeted monies. - D. CHURCH COUNCIL

Unapproved Church Council Minutes, February 18, 2020

Absent- Wendy Blomberg, Karen Stanze, Ken Gerardy and Mary Evans

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Bill Work.

Dwelling in the Word: Katherine Lacroix opened with devotion.

Minutes- A motion to approve the January minutes was made by Michael Wagner, seconded by Al Mohling, all approved.

Treasures Report- Gail Kruse presented.

Pastor's Report- Pastor Gauck reported he made one hospital call, had eight drop in's, conferences and visits, attended six committee meetings, five worship services including Lutjen funeral and two council meetings. Services are planned out through Easter. Upcoming vacation dates are March 21-28th, May 18 - June 1st, Reunion June 18 -22nd, September to be determined, and November 14- 22nd, coverage is still to be determined.

Committee Reports- Budget and Finance presented council with three options to increase interest income. After review Al Mohling made a motion to go with option two. They will move \$20,000.00 from the Mutual Investment checking into Mission Investment CD's. Funds will be split, \$10,000.00 into a one-year Mission Investment CD and \$10,000.00 into a two-year Mission Investment CD. This will increase our current rate interest by \$148.00. Bob Karls seconded the motion and all approved. Long Range Planning reported Katherine Lacroix has scheduled an appointment with attorney Gene Melton and Don and Gloria Peterson to discuss the Steward McFadden scholarship fund. She is also looking to speak with the ELCA about how and where the money is invested. Stewardship reported they will continue to focus on the different ways of Stewardship with Temple Talks and newsletters. Property reported they installed LED lights in first two pendants central to entering the church. Property was encouraged to do the remaining pendants as this will bring the church area closer to being fully LED. Easter Pageant walkways will be getting some gravel work, but the drainage ditch won't be improved till the area dries out. Worship and Music reported the Seder meal service will be in the fellowship hall. Sign-ups will be requested for this meal.

Old Business- Tentative date for Council to meet with Rev. Kendra Noble about the results of the Church Vitality Survey was set for March 10th at 6:00 pm.

New Business- Annual Synod Assembly will be held June 4-6th at the Renaissance Hotel in St. Louis. The Theme is "God's Vitality Among Us: We are Church". It is requested that each congregation send two voting members, one man one woman. If interested contact Bill Work or any council member. Room, board and Assembly fees are paid for including mileage reimbursement. Pastor and Jan will be attending. Lenten offering was discussed. Al Mohling made a motion to allocate Lenten offerings between the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response and Kent Memorial's General fund. Michael Wagner seconded the motion and all approved. Audit Committee reported all records were found to be current, correct and properly maintained.

Correspondence- Thank you note from Joyce Wanamaker for the gift card. Thank you note received from Lake of the Ozarks Idiot Club for the donation of \$682.90 taken from the Darlene Mueller Memorial.

Motion to adjourn was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Katherine Lacroix, all approved.

Meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.

We have wonderful costumes and props, and a pre-recorded soundtrack for our presentation.


