In order to successfully call a minister at the Special Congregational Meeting we will need a physical quorum of voting members. Voting for a candidate by proxy is not permitted. (As stated in our Constitution, Page 29, section C10.05.)

The Special Congregational meeting will have only two questions that require resolution: 1) Shall the candidate be called to serve as Pastor of Kent Memorial Church; 2) Shall the initial annual compensation: (an itemized list of compensation, based on CSS-ELCA guidelines) be approved? Both votes will be by written ballot.
