Unapproved Church Council Minutes, June 16, 2020

Guest- Call Committee- Gail Kruse, Jim Melody, Gary Wiles, Chuck Wanamaker, Terri Stout, and Katie Heaford

Absent- Katherine Lacroix and Bob Harger

Meeting called to order at 6pm by President Bill Work.

Dwelling in the Word: Melba Bangert opened with devotion.

Minutes- A motion to approve minutes from Council meetings May 19th and email meeting May 22nd was made by Michael Wagner, Seconded by Wendy Blomberg and all approved.

Treasures Report- Gail Kruse presented.

Pastor's Report- Pastor Gauck reported he had twelve drop-in conferences and visits, attended five Council meetings, six committee meetings, five worship services and one baptism. Worship services are planned through summer. Next vacation is tentatively planned for June 13-22 and November 7-14, coverage to be announced.

Committee Reports- Call Committee presented Council with a recommendation for a possible Pastor candidate. After discussion Al Mohling made a motion to accept the Candidate recommended by the Call Committee. Michael Wagner seconded the motion and all approved. Finance presented Council with a possible financial package to be presented to the Candidate. Melba Bangert made a motion to authorize the President, Vice President and the chair of the Finance Committee to negotiate a salary package with the Candidate. Bob Karls seconded the motion and all approved. Worship & Music reported all the equipment has been ordered to help with the continuation of ZOOM services. Funding is adequate using "virtual service donations and memorial monies. Communion will be celebrated every Sunday at the 10am service. Outdoor service will commune on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

Old Business- Mask wearing was discussed. Mary Evans made a motion that wearing a mask will be at the individual's discretion. Motion was seconded by Wendy Blomberg. One objection observed. Social distancing is still recommended. Gail Kruse updated council on PPP. One half of the funds have been used. Discussion was held on what to do with the remainder of the funds. Michael Wagner made a motion to hold off

on any disbursements of PPP funds until it has been used as required and the loan is forgiven. Al Mohling seconded the motion and all approved.

New Business- June Cruise worship is canceled and will be reconsidered for July. Discussion was held on the rummage sale. It will be planned to go forward and revisited for specifics. Discussion was held on Bishop Candea's Justice Matters Remarks and Statement of the Synod Council.

Correspondence- Thank you from The Lake of the Ozarks Idiots Club for our donation of \$749.46. (money from the Darlene Mueller Memorial)

Motion to adjourn was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

Meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

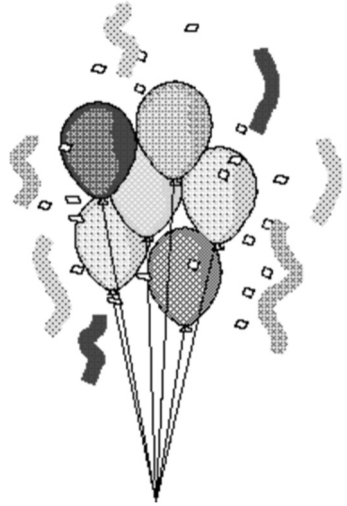

From the Women of the ELCA Newsletter—

Dear Women of ELCA [Kent Memorial Lutheran Church],

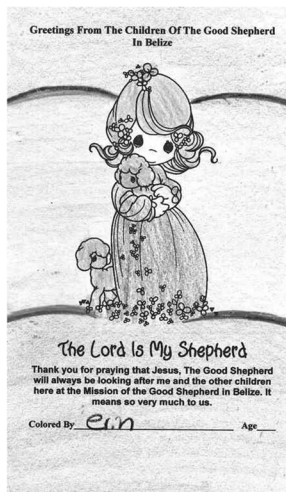
I have lived at the Mission of the Good Shepherd in Belize Central America for the past 15 years. I grew up at the Mission. I am an adult now, went to college with the help of Pastor Post, and I have come back to the Mission to help Pastor Post. But, I want to tell you something sad. Pastor Post, who came from the US as a Missionary over 15 years ago, sent out nearly 100 letters to Pastors asking for prayers for some special children in need here in Belize, and he got no response. He couldn't believe it. No one was willing to pray for these children. No one wrote back to him. Although somebody suggested that maybe they prayed but were just too busy to let us know. This could be.

I know that the bible says that we should pray for one another. And I know that most Pastors are extremely overworked, with very little time even for themselves let alone prayer time for those outside their own congregations. And so that is why, as a woman, I am writing to the Women of ELCA. Would you be willing to pray for some children who are really in need of your prayers? Their names are Erin Garbutt, Stephanie Westby, Stacy Westby, Stephanie Logan and little Dionnie Westby. Although we have other children here at the Mission who could use prayers, these are the children who we need special prayers for right now. These children have very immediate, urgent needs that only God can help with.

It is hard to believe that a Missionary, who has given up his whole life to travel to a 3rd world country to bring the gospel to people, who has spent over 16 years working with some of the most underprivileged children in this country, and then got no response when writing to his own people back home asking for prayers. Pastor Post seemed really down that he didn't hear back from anybody. I told him that maybe the Pastors prayed but just didn't let him know. But anyway, that's why I decided to send this letter to the Lutheran Women of your Church. As a woman, I know that women care, especially Lutheran women. And they pray.

If the Women of ELCA, or anyone else from your congregation, will pray for these children, please email or write to me and let me know so that I can tell Pastor Post. I have very little to offer you in return for your prayers, but if you will do this, I will send you a hand colored picture each month by one of the children who you will be praying for, similar to the one that I have enclosed by little Erin Garbutt.
