Jesus Christ, and Him Crucified

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God. 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

I was 16 years old and probably a bit too serious for my age, and I was sitting in a meadow in the mountains, leaning up against a magnificent Douglas Fir tree, and contemplating my future. I had for years planned on being a surgeon like Hawkeye on M*A*S*H*, but during that summer I had come to realize that being a surgeon probably wouldn't be as fun as it looked like on TV, and wouldn't provide the human interaction that I would have liked. So what would I do? What did God want me to do? I should mention that I was having this discussion with myself and with God at a Lutheran Church Camp in Colorado. But whether it was the location or the interaction I was having with other young Christians, or just the right time for the Holy Spirit to break in to my life, it was there, with the scent of wildflowers and that distinctive mix of pine and vanilla that perfumes a fir tree, that I first had the thought that maybe God was calling me to be a pastor.

It has been 40 years now since that day at Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp. And through all of the mostly ups and a few downs of education and ministry I still feel that same need to be a part of making God's love real in people's lives, not so much with words of wisdom, but with acts of kindness and love and grace.

And so now I am honored to begin this wonderful adventure with you. I must admit that the excitement has been almost uncontainable the last few weeks as I have wrapped up my ministry in Kansas and have prepared to begin our journey together on the Lake of the Ozarks.

Where have you felt God's calling? Was it to a congregation or a particular ministry? Was it to a job or a hobby? Or was it to a particular person or group of people that God was drawing you to love and to care for?

Where do you feel God calling you today? Calling our community and our congregation? Where does the good news of Christ crucified need to be proclaimed? Where and how can we best proclaim that Gospel?

I look forward to hearing your faith stories, and learning where you feel the Holy Spirit's leading over these next few weeks and months.

Unapproved Minutes—August 20, 2020

Absent- Bill Work, Gail Kruse

Meeting called to order at 6pm by Vice President Bob Karls.

Dwelling in the Word: Al Mohling opened with devotion.

Minutes- A motion to approve minutes from Council meeting Aug. 9th was made by Michael Wagner, seconded by Katherine Lacroix, all approved. A motion to approve minutes from Council meeting July 21st was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

Treasures Report- Al Mohling presented.

Pastor's Report- Pastor Gauck reported from July 1st thru August 19th he had seventeen drop in conferences and visits, attended five committee meetings, two council meetings, and has had seven worship services. Worship services are planned out to Advent. Pastor Gauck will take Pastor Ed to the area Pastors breakfast meeting September 2, at Val's. No vacations have been taken.

Committee Reports- Evangelism reported Lorraine Boyd's 90th Birthday (Sept. 12th) celebration will be held September 13th followed by "Gods Work Our Hands". Budget & Finance presented the 2021 Financial Budget Process. Forms will be sent to all committees and will need to be returned by September 10th to Al Mohling. Long Range Planning will be visiting Pastor Ed on future plans for the committee. Long Range also requested a small budget to cover the cost of the Scholarship celebration. Al will make sure they have the appropriate request form. They have discussed a new pictorial possibly by Lifetouch. Stewardship will have a temple talk on the letter R-Resources on September 6th. Property reported several volunteers have donated their time to various projects. Parsonage improvements include the deck has been power washed and painted. The exhaust fan hood was removed and the stove moved over to make room for a new 12inch cabinet. A new over the stove microwave was installed. New shelving was added to the tall cabinet, Oasis Tree Service cleared trees for a better view of the lake from the deck. Mulch and plants will be added to the front. Thank you all for your time and talents. One job request for water damage on the wall at the bottom of the steps needs to be completed. Social Ministry reported they will not have the Annual Bingo night this year, too risky with COVID. Worship & Music reported Choir rehearsals will resume wearing masks except to sing the anthem. Bell Choir has started rehearsing and will play "As the Deer" for Pastor Gauck's last service on August 30th. A plan is in place for the Kent Klowns to teach the congregation to sign some of the words to "Amazing Grace" for use at the installation service as hymn of the day with Vanessa Hebrank singing the words.

Old Business- The next Cruise Worship will be September 17th, details are

being planned. PPP update- A form 3508 is being created and is not available at this time. Michael Wagner is recommending to his customers to hold off for a new easier form that they are trying to get through congress. Gail Kruse will check with Oak Star. CoMo Connect- Looking for the best option for connection. They could possibly piggyback from the parsonage to the church. Discussion was held on restarting donuts, bread and crosses. Wendy Blomberg made a motion to start doughnuts, coffee, crosses and bread starting Sept. 6th with proper COVID procedures. Katherine Lacroix seconded the motion, motion carried.

New Business- Pastor Gauck presented council with a list of those that need to be removed from the Official Kent Membership Roster. Wendy Blomberg made a motion to remove the presented list of members from the roster. Seconded by Mary Evans and all approved. Pastor Gauck emailed everyone the exit interview form. He asked it be filled out and returned to him by September 17th or sooner. Pastor Ed will be here on September 1st. It was discussed to have a Welcoming Committee for those that are able to attend. He may need some help unloading. We could possibly bring some freezer meals. Tracy will check on his arrival time. Evangelism will plan the Welcome Celebration. Tracy Garrett will be celebrating 10yrs of service at Kent Memorial. A motion was made by Melba to give Tracy flowers and a gift card. Celebration date will be determined. Michael Wagner seconded the motion and all approved. Pastor Gauck will be celebrating 50 yrs. of ordination on November 26th. Celebration details tabled. Church start time was discussed for single service. Property suggested moving services to 10am. Worship & Music also recommended a start time of 10am. Factors being weather, more time to remove snow, daylight for choir rehearsals and Sunday school. Pastor Ed said he would be fine with whatever was decided. STEWARDSHIP FOCUS

Stewardship Focus - September

Everything we have is a gift from God,
and stewardship is our response to these gifts!

This month we focus on the next letter from the S.T.E.W.A.R.D. model, the letter R. representing stewardship of our Resources. Our focus on Resources has us look at how we treat and use the finances and possessions that God has entrusted to us.

With “R”, our Resources, we get to the stereotypical definition of Stewardship, the theme that most of us think of when we hear the dreaded word Stewardship, Money. Money and possessions are the second most referenced topic in the Bible. Money is mentioned 800 times, so it must be important. How are we treating and utilizing our finances? Are we using them to help others? Are we using them to give glory and honor to God?

At times when someone says Stewardship, we hear “open your wallets you heathens.” But that’s not what God tells us: he tells us to Love our neighbor; he tells us how he blesses those who give. St Paul puts it this way in 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 “The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the person who sows generously will also reap generously. Each one of you should give just as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, because God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace overflow to you so that because you have enough of everything in every way at all times, you will overflow in every good work.”

Many times we struggle when we think of Biblical lessons about money thinking that God must not want us to have money. But 1 Timothy reminds us that it is not money that is evil, but it is “the love of money that is the root of all evil.” Let’s not have money be the center of our lives, but let us use it to honor God and help others.

So, getting back to St Paul’s thoughts about reaping what we sow, let’s strive to sow bountifully, so we can reap his graces!

Other verses to ponder: Psalm 112: 9, 1 Timothy 6:9-10, Leviticus 27:30, Proverbs 3: 9-10, 11:24-25 & 22:9, 1 Corinthians 16:2, Luke 6:38

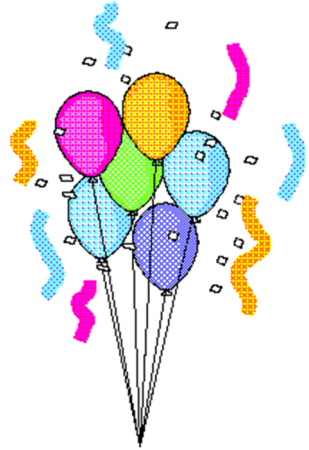
