GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS. at Kent Memorial was completed over several days. Before Pastor Ed arrived, the parsonage grounds were spruced up. On Sept. 11 over 50 dozen cookies (maybe closer to 70 dozen) were delivered to Lake Regional Hospital, 6 Fire Stations, 2 police stations, 2 ambulance stations, the resource officer and staff at Hurricane Deck, and the American Legion. On GWOH Sunday itself we had 40 people helping out at the Laurie City Park, Hurricane Deck School, Community for Christ, Picking up trash along the road, and at Kent. In total, we had over 80 people spending at least 143 hours doing God's Work. Thank you to everyone.

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN OKTOBERFEST is just around the corner. The date is October 3, 2020 from 4 pm-7 pm.
