Also we are sharing a few brief examples of how funds are being used to help others: 1) A single Mom of 2 needed assistance in Feb. with rent and electric, Kent pledged \$150, along with other agencies her need was helped. 2) A family of 4 in Feb. needed help with rent, Kent pledged \$100 and again in partnering with others the need was met. 3) A grandmother housing 7 grandchildren needed a place to stay while work was done on electric, Kent helped with 2 nights lodging, \$158 and again others agencies assisted with other nights until work was completed.

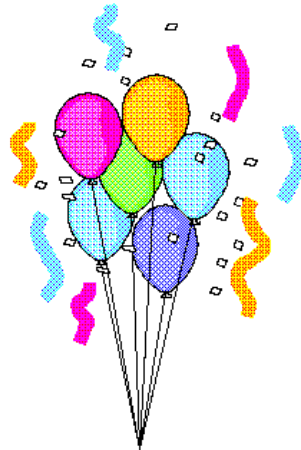

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by President Bill Work.

**Dwelling in the Word:** Kathy Fair opened with devotion.

**Minutes-** A motion to approve the February Council minutes was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

**Treasures Report-** Gail Kruse reported

**Pastor's Report-** Pastor Ed and Mary finished up the house in Kansas and it is under contract. He thanks all who came out in the snow to plow the parking lot, shovel, and salt the walks. Pastor Ed reported he has conducted four worship services, two mid-week services, one funeral, two home visits and eleven phone conferences and one counseling session. He has attended three men's bible study classes and two women's bible study classes. He has also attended five committee meetings. All upcoming events are on schedule.

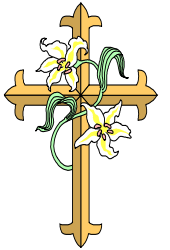

# STEWARDSHIP FOCUS

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Everything we have is a gift from God,  
and stewardship is our response to these gifts!

As I write this we are preparing for the Big day, Easter! We are planning Worship services of **grand celebration**, we are preparing large meals and Easter egg hunts for our gatherings of family & friends (maybe not as much this year as in years past). The point is that we focus a lot on that One day.

But Easter is more than one day on the calendar each year. God's message of redemption and forgiveness of our sins is something we should celebrate and share year-round. So how can we be Stewards of the Easter message throughout the year?

Therese Borchard in her article in Guideposts.com, 6 Ways to Celebrate Easter Year Round, shares these suggestions:

**Simply Believe**, "Easter is about believing—even when it's hard. It's about letting go of our requirement for an explanation and taking God's word at face value."

**Seek Aliveness**, "...looking for opportunities that make us feel alive or impassioned."

**Spread Joy**, "Jesus is risen. Death is defeated. All sin is forgiven. We enjoy eternal life." That's a lot to celebrate and share.

**Be open to Possibility**, "Easter prods us to envision possibilities that are out of our realm of understanding, trusting God has a master plan that makes sense."

**Let go of Fear**, "We become afraid when we don't understand things." But the angel told Mary to not be afraid. So "each time we abandon our fear, we celebrate Easter."

**Recognize Jesus in our Lives**, "Celebrating Easter is being cognizant of the coincidences or heart-burning moments in our lives when we feel Jesus' presence."

I would add, **Pray for Others**, so that the blessings we receive because of Easter day can be shared with others throughout the year.

Buckner.com has some great ideas for interacting with our children and grandchildren. It gives age appropriate movie suggestions that we can watch with our kids and grandkids, preschool, middle school, high school. We can also read the Easter story to them. They recommend the story from a children's bible for preschool children, and Mark 14 & John 19-20 for middle & high school children. We don't have to restrict these activities to just around Easter day, we can do these anytime throughout

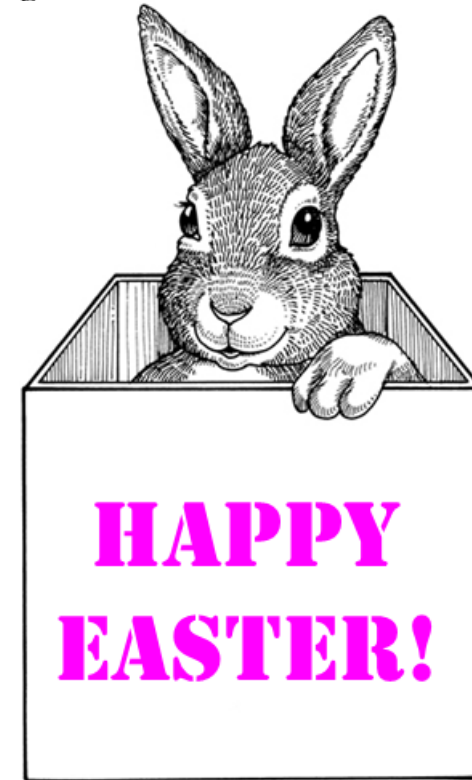
