FROM PASTOR ED

In our Gospel lesson this week we hear again the story of Jesus calming of the storm. The disciples are terrified when the storm threatens to swamp the boat while Jesus sleeps. And they are amazed, maybe even more terrified, when Jesus, with a word, calms the sea and rebukes the storm. Jesus, they discover, has power over the wind and the waves, the elements themselves and in truth, the entire creation. Do we dare have faith in him, when the stakes are high, and everything tells us we should be afraid? There are surely storms on The Lake, and storms on the sea. There are storms in our lives and yes, indeed there are storms in our community and our world. In the midst of these we can have confidence, we can dare to believe, that Jesus is master of the wind and the waves and all of the storms that beset us.
