In today's gospel many people take offense at Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh and drink his blood; even many of Jesus' disciples peel off. This is the backdrop in John's gospel for Peter's confession of faith. "To whom can we go?" asks Peter, in words we sometimes sing just before the gospel is read. "You have the words of eternal life." In order to take such a stand, as Peter and Joshua did, Paul tells us to arm ourselves with the word of God. We pray in the Spirit that we might be bold ambassadors of the gospel.

EARTHQUAKE RELIEF FOR HAITI A devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck southwest Haiti on Saturday morning, August 14. Haiti was also hit by Tropical Storm Grace on Monday night, which caused severe flooding in communities already damaged by the earthquake.

Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with partner organizations in the communities of Haiti to meet relief needs, including food, water, medical supplies and temporary shelter. Gifts to "Haiti Crisis" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the earthquake in Haiti. Checks may be written to Kent Memorial; be sure to write “Haiti Crisis” on the memo line.
