

FROM PASTOR ED

Our church year ends this Sunday with the proclamation that Christ is our King. In contrast to human rulers, our King serves and provides for us rather than demanding that we provide for him. This reversal of roles is a model of leadership, and also as Good Friday would prove, a challenge to human authority in every form. How do we honor and serve a King who also serves us? Where do we resist God's rule over our lives? Where do we see our King's dominion breaking into our lives and into our world?

Next Sunday a new church year begins. With Advent we look forward both to Christ's coming again as celebrating his first "advent" into our world. But this Sunday we proclaim that the Child born in the Bethlehem stable, washed in the Jordan and crucified on Calvary is our King.

Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love.
