FROM PASTOR ED

In this week's lesson from the Gospel of Luke, John The Baptist "prepares" the way of the Lord by calling the crowds that had come out to him to bear fruit worthy of repentance. His voice surely calls across the centuries, pointing us towards the one who is greater than himself, while also insisting that our lives match our proclamation. As Christmas approaches, how can we bear fruit worthy of repentance? Having been turned away from sin and all of those things which would keep us from loving God and loving our neighbor, what do we want to do? What do we need to do? What kind of fruit will we bear?

NOTE: Sunday, December 12 is “Pearl Sunday” – if you have pearls that you rarely get to wear, now’s your chance. Wear them to church on Sunday.
