

Confession and Forgiveness

P: The seemingly simple events at the Cana wedding strikingly foretell the life, work and mission of our Savior, Jesus. At Cana Mary told those serving the wine, "Do whatever he tells you," and they listened.

C: Then in the upper room, Jesus told his disciples as they drank a cup of wine, "Drink of it, all of you. For those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Do this in remembrance of me." And they obeyed.

P: At Cana the servants drew some of the good wine and took it to the chief steward, who drank and

called the bridegroom's work a success.

C: But at Golgotha, servants soaked a sponge with sour wine and pressed it to the mouth of the crucified Jesus. He drank the bitter drink and boldly declared, "It is finished!"

P: With the good wine of Cana, all the guests celebrated the start of a joyous marriage.

C: And at the glorious marriage feast of the Lamb, there will be even greater rejoicing. At that time every wine-jar will be filled and all the mountains shall drip with sweet wine.

P: At the earthly banquet, the servants at Cana filled the jugs of wine to the brim and human hearts were gladdened.

C: And at the heavenly feast, vats shall overflow with wine and we will be sated, not with wine, but with the love of the Lord.
