

FROM PASTOR ED

Having risen from the dead Jesus now meets the disciples on the shore of the sea of Galilee. After a miraculous catch of fish and a breakfasting on them, Jesus asks Peter three times, "do you love me?" And three times Peter replies, Yes, Lord I love you. Jesus commands him to take care of his sheep. The threefold affirmation of his love does indeed correspond to his trice denial of Jesus before his crucifixion, but this is more than penance for Peter's earlier betrayal.

Jesus commissions Peter to be the leader of his followers in his absence. It will be a leadership born out of love for Jesus and concerned with caring for, loving, and feeding Jesus' lambs. It is still the model for

the community of Jesus' followers. We are bound together by our love for Jesus, and our mission is to care for all of those whom Jesus loves.
