

6:00 p.m.

Does God really sound like Charlton Heston?

While I love the movie *The 10 Commandments* as much as anyone, there is a whole lot more to the story of God's salvation of his people from bondage to slavery in Egypt than Cecil B. DeMille included in the movie. The Book of Exodus is the defining story of the Hebrew and Jewish peoples. Its themes are used to define and explain the work of Christ, and just as God's promise to Abraham is fulfilled in Jesus, so too God's work of salvation that was begun in Moses comes to completion on the cross and through the empty tomb. Just as the story of the Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob are foundational to both Christian and Jewish (and in many ways Muslim) thought, so too the story of the Exodus, God's people's sojourn in the desert and their final arrival at the Promised Land is intertwined in our faith and theology. It was the Passover meal that Jesus was eating with his disciples, and, we are told, he is the true Passover lamb. In other words, this is good stuff!

I would love for you to join us Wednesday evenings at 6 pm, beginning April 27, as we continue our evening Bible Study with a look into this fascinating and thought producing book. I will put together a short recap of Genesis for those who may have missed something, and for anyone new who might want to join us, and we will continue to offer the Bible Study both in person and on Zoom so both those who are joining from a distance and anyone who might need to miss being with us in person can continue to participate as they wish. ## Church Council Minutes –March 15, 2022

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by President Kathy Fair.

**Dwelling in the Word:** Bob Karls opened with devotion.

**Minutes-** A motion to approve the March Council meeting minutes was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

**Treasures Report-** Gail Kruse reported

**Pastor's Report-** Pastor Ed reported he has conducted four worship services, five mid-week services and one funeral. He has had two home visits, two shut-in visits and four counseling visits. He attended the WELCA, helped with Buddy packs and Zero the Hero. Pastor thanked everyone for a wonderful Lent, Holy Week and Easter. He felt that everyone in the congregation probably helped in some way during this season. It was a blessed season for him and for so many of your brothers and sisters in the congregation and in our community. Pastor tried with no success to contact the printer for the pictorial directory. He will be obtaining a quote from another company. He would like to start taking pictures in June and early July. Pastor reported the cost to update the audio & video equipment in the outdoor worship area would be approximately \$4,300.00. There are memorial monies that have been designated for these updates. Al Mohling made a motion to use appropriated memorial funds for the purchase of the outdoor sound equipment. When memorial fund have been depleted the remaining balance will be paid with Thrivent Choice Dollars. Seconded by Bob Karls and Wendy Blomberg, all approved. There were 48 in attendance for Sunrise Service; approximately 100 attended the Easter Pageant. The Easter Pageant brought in \$468.00 and the breakfast proceeds totaled \$392.00. We will soon be welcoming six new members.

**Committee Reports-** Christian Education reported they will have Sunday morning Bible study at 9 am. And Wednesday Evening Bible Study will resume April 27<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm. -Evangelism reported the Chamber passed out Easter flyers. Vinny is holding a benefit raffle for the Buddy Pack program. He has donated a six night trip to Mexico valued at \$3,900.00. Tickets are one for \$10.00 or three for \$25.00; see Vinny at the restaurant to purchase a ticket. He will also be hosting the golf tournament on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. -Budget & Finance reported they have plans to get with the Audit Committee to discuss Audit procedures. -Long Range

Planning reported they have chosen seven students to receive a \$1,000.00 scholarship. Reception will be May 1<sup>st</sup> after services. Procedure for scholarships will be put together for future reference. -Property reported they had a lot of volunteers to help with the raising and taking down of the Easter wall, cleaning the parking lot and grounds, fixing doors, replacing filters, sharing equipment and many other tasks. Thank you to all that share your time and talents! See Property Committee report for a full list of task and volunteers. -Social Ministry reported March deposit was \$500.00 and expenses were \$590.00. They are keeping up with needs at this time. They have a current balance of \$3,491.00. -Worship & Music reported Greater Lake Area Chorale will be at Kent on May 7<sup>th</sup>. WELCA will host a reception with cookies, punch and coffee. Outdoor service will begin on May 29<sup>th</sup>. -WELCA reported they will host a spring salad luncheon on May 6<sup>th</sup> and Newcomers May 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Old Business**-The Audio and Visual committee reported they have not filled the position, candidate took another job. Delegates are needed for the Synod Assembly, June 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> in Kansas City. If interested in attending contact Pastor Ed. Discussion on Council retreat, goals will be long range planning and what this committee should be responsible for. .

**New Business**- Columbarium- When do we need to think about adding to the Columbarium? The committee will meet to discuss the need. Bill Work made a motion to move the next council meeting from May 17<sup>th</sup> to May 16<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm. Wendy Blomberg seconded the motion and all approved.
