

Of all the characters who make an appearance in the Nativity Story, Joseph may be the most enigmatic. He seems almost an afterthought or an embarrassment; the child to be born by his beloved is not his own, yet the child will bear his name and his family heritage. Joseph's brave, even heroic faithfulness can nearly be missed, yet the salvation of the entire world depends on him.

As we approach the holiness of the incarnation, our faithfulness will not always be seen, lauded or praised, but as we respond to God's call, we bring the gifts of God to the world. Like Joseph, your faith,

your love, your willingness to believe God's word and act upon it even when it seems impossible, makes room for the Christ Child to thrive in the world He came to save.

Welcome to Worship

Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday in Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

Lighting the Advent Candle -- Joseph

- P: Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, he took her as his wife (Matthew 1).
- P: Today we remember Joseph, called to believe the most unlikely of stories, to trust God in the face of ridicule and dishonor, and hoping against hope that his beloved Mary was faithful, and the mother of God.
- C: Today we give thanks for Joseph, who raised God's Son as his own, believing God and risking everything to protect this holy family. And we give thanks as well for the Josephs among us, fiercely devoted to the ones they love, unwavering in their faith that God has called them to love, protect and nurture their holy families.
- P: On this fourth Sunday of Advent, we light this candle as a symbol of Joseph, whose love of God transformed his love of his family into heroism, and provided a place for the Christ Child to lay his head.

Prayer of Confession

All: We know the words, O God. We decry the commercialism of the season and bemoan the loss of the meaning of these days of your Son's birth. We shake our heads and wonder at how secular this sacred time has become. We know the words, and yet we have become too-willing participants. We have spent more time shopping, and decorating, and cooking than we have in praying our devotions. Forgive us our sins, O Lord.

Words of Forgiveness

- P: In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Lord, give us not the Christmas we have chosen but rather give us the Christmas you have chosen. Give us a glimpse of holiness, and let the hunger and longing well-up in us until we feel compelled to go in search of the one who is lying in a manger.
- C: Amen.
