As our 40 days of Lent begin, we remember Jesus 40 days in the wilderness. We are told that it was a time of fasting and prayer for Jesus where he was tempted by the devil. Lent is for us an especially spiritual time as well, where we may choose to engage in some kind of discipline (like fasting) to focus on our relationship with our God. As Jesus overcame the devil's temptations, what can we learn about Jesus, and about ourselves? How can our 40 days of Lent bring us closer to God and to one another?
