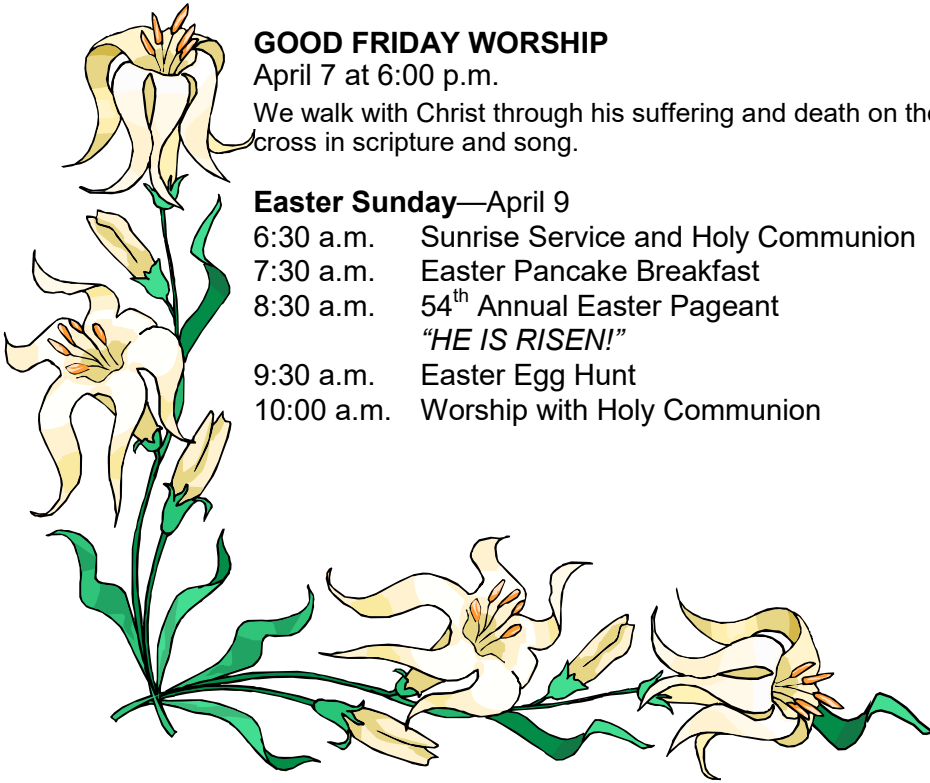

Meeting called to order at 5:50 pm by President Kathy Fair

Dwelling in the Word: Bill Work opened with devotion.

Minutes- Amend February minutes to read; The Men's Easter Breakfast will be a "free will donation" with those funds going to the Easter Pageant minus expenses. A motion to approve the February Council meeting minutes as corrected was made by Bill Work, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

Treasures Report- Gail Kruse reported

Pastor's Report- Pastor Ed reported he has conducted four worship services and one Wednesday evening service. He has had two home visits and one shut-in visit and two counseling visits. He attended the meetings of Altar Guild, Evangelism, Finance, Long Range Planning, Worship & Music and Congregational Council. He has attended the men and women's Bible study and the Wednesday evening Bible study. He participated in WELCA and Buddy Packs. Pastor reported we are fully into Lent. Wednesday services, potlucks and chanting the Psalms are preview to Holy Week. We will be having the Seder meal on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday service and Easter Day Festivities. Ten people came for drive through ashes. The new Grief Support Group met for the first time. Pastor reported it went very well and had received good feedback from the participants. Next meeting will be April 20th at 3pm. Pastor met with Stephen Phelps from the ELCA foundation, who will be undergoing open heart surgery; his plan is to heal and hope to see us in May.

Committee Reports- Evangelism reported they will celebrate the anniversaries of Joe and Pat Poretta on April 23rd and Don and Joan Wilken on April 30th. The New Member Service went well. They are making plans to see Queen Esther at Sight and Sound in the fall. -Budget & Finance- Gail Kruse made a motion to have Robert C. Karls and William A. Work removed from the General checking account and replaced with Kathleen D. Fair and Michael T. Wagner as new signees. Motion was seconded by Wendy Blomberg and all approved. -Kathy Fair on behalf of the Finance committee presented council with a new Audit Committee Procedures and motioned for approval. Wendy Blomberg seconded the motion and all approved. -Long Range Planning reported Scholarship applications have been turned in from Macks Creek and Versailles. They are still waiting for Camdenton and Westlake Christian Academy. A May 7th reception is planned for the Scholarship recipients. Plans are in the works for the 75th anniversary of Kent. -Stewardship reported they will focus on the Hymn "Now the Green Blade Rises", making reference to coming into Life and Love. Being Stewards of the Earth. -Property reported Lynn Burke put in a GFCI outlet on the pole located in the Easter Pageant area for the sound system and replaced a turnbuckle for the backdrop. Warren and Rhonda have been doing spring

cleanup in the Columbarium area. Tom's HVAC has repaired furnace #2 for the back part of the Fellowship Hall. -Social Ministry reported they started the month with \$6,415.11 and ended with \$5,609.00. They have helped 18 families with utilities bills totaling \$1,828.00 in January and February. Festival of Sharing collection will be in July, the Bingo fundraiser is planned for September 8th and the Loving Tree will be put up in November. -Worship & Music reported plans are underway for Holy Week. -WELCA reported the Spring Cluster meeting will be April 29th from 9a.m. to around 2 p.m. Eldeen Hanke reported the Spring Luncheon will be May 5th. They will have a quilt raffle.

Old Business- Photo directory is making great progress. Curb cut was discussed and it was decided that a 4' wide x 6' long ramp will be poured outside the Fellowship Hall double doors. We will get bids on the project.

New Business- Council had discussion on adding an Assistant Treasurer or Deputy position so if the need arises they would easily be able to step in to fill any voids. President Kathy Fair shared information from the new Church insurance policy. She also discussed a new column for the newsletter titled "Did You Know?" sharing various tidbits about the Church, Committees and what might go on behind the scene. For example "Did You Know?" that the yellow tablet on the corner of Tracy's desk is there for anyone to leave her a note or message? Committees will be encouraged to share their "Did You Know" facts.

Correspondence- Thank you card from Hurricane Deck Elementary Future Christian Athletes for the donuts Pastor purchased.

Motion to adjourn was made by Jim Mellody, seconded by Bob Karls and all approved.

Meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm.

Love Abides... Grief Support Group

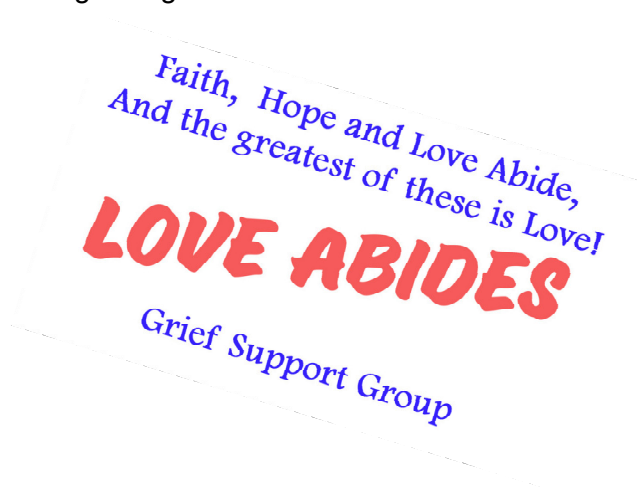
