

Welcome to Worship

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In Acts the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world.

Welcome

Confession and Forgiveness

P: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord + Jesus Christ, by whose Spirit we have been reborn to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

C: Amen.

P: Rejoicing in Christ's victory over sin and death, let us come before God who calls us to repentance.

Silence is kept for reflection

P: God of life,

C: by the resurrection of your Son you make everything new. Newness scares us, and we confess to shutting our doors in fear. We have not listened to voices that challenge us. We have resisted the Holy Spirit moving us in new directions. Our hearts are slow to believe your promises. Forgive us, O God, and renew us to embrace without fear the new life you have given us in Jesus Christ. Amen.

P: People of God: Christ is alive, and death has lost its power. Through the waters of baptism you have been born anew by the living word of God. Know that your sins are forgiven in + Jesus' name and that the Spirit of the risen Christ is alive in you both now and forever.

C: Amen.

Call To Worship

P: On Pentecost, the life of the Spirit was poured out onto all parts of the world.

C: Today we see the Spirit alive almost everywhere we turn.

P: On Pentecost, the life of the Spirit entered into Peter, and he began to preach.

C: Today the Spirit is alive in the words of all those who preach God's Word.

P: On Pentecost, the life of the Spirit caused people to speak the Gospel in many languages.

C: Today the Spirit is alive in words that we use to defend the faith in the presence of those who do not believe.

P: On Pentecost, the life of the Spirit inspired many to be baptized and to live as children of God.

C: Today the Spirit is still alive in the waters of baptism.

P: On Pentecost, the life of the Spirit moved people to become Christ's disciples.

C: Today the Spirit is alive in our hearts as we are moved to serve in the kingdom of God.

P: Come, Holy Spirit, and spread your life among us!

C: Amen.
