

In our Gospel lesson this week we hear the Parable of the Wicked Tenants. In the parable, the tenants of a vineyard refuse to give the owner of the vineyard its produce. They beat the messengers sent collect it and

when the owner of the vineyard sends his son, they kill him. Foreshadowing his own death in just a few days, Jesus challenges the religious leaders of his day to be good stewards of the great treasure God has entrusted to them: the spiritual life of God's people.

What great treasures has God entrusted to us? To his Church? To our congregation? Are we being faithful in our care of The Gospel and the people whom God so loves?
