Our Gospel lesson this week again focuses on John the Baptist. When John appeared with his message of repentance and forgiveness and baptizing people in the Jordan, everyone wanted to know who he was. Was he the Messiah, or Elijah or one of the other prophets? John insists that his only mission is to prepare the way of the one who is so much greater than himself. In his own flamboyant way, John pointed away from himself to Jesus. How do our lives direct people's attention to their Lord and savior? How are we, like John, preparers of the Lord's way?
