

for us than it was for Philip as the barriers to faith seem to grow day by day. But after all these centuries, faith in Jesus is still most often spread by individual people inviting those they care about to come and see, to come and experience Jesus for themselves.

Welcome to Worship

All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just pastors and deacons but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called “the house of God, and . . . the gate of heaven” (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

Help us recognize your voice in our lives. Give us the eagerness of Samuel to jump up, in the middle of the night, to respond to your call. Forgive us when we ignore you or make excuses. Work in us a willing spirit. We pray in the name of the one who calls us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
