You are invited to use this time of musical offering to prepare for worship, to open yourself to God, our Father, his Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, present in this place.

An Epiphany Litany

P: From the darkest recesses of space, God spoke in a loud voice for six days, saying, "Let there be..." and there was.

C: From far away, God spoke to all creation.

P: From within a vision, God spoke to Abraham about becoming the father of many nations.

C: From the far reaches of a dream, God spoke of a covenant he would never forget.

P: From high on Mt. Sinai, God spoke in a loud voice telling Israel his commands and decrees.

C: From far away, God spoke to his people of old.

P: Now the Words of God come from a very human voice, from a seemingly ordinary man.

C: Christ comes – fully human yet fully divine.

P: Standing in the synagogue with the people of Galilee, Christ taught them about the Scriptures.

C: From among people like us, Christ spoke with wisdom from above.

P: Surrounded by the sick and the demon-possessed, Christ took their diseases away and ordered their demons to be silent.

C: From among people like us, Christ stood out as one who could heal with a touch.

P: Present with us now, Christ cares for the needs of the Church.

C: From the midst of people gathered here, Christ is still teaching and touching, healing and serving by his Spirit's power.

P: For wherever two or three are gathered in his name,

C: there Christ dwells in the midst of them.

P: Speak to us, Lord!

C: May we know you among us.

Confession and Forgiveness

P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

P: Today we hear the voice of him who speaks with authority, the promised Prophet of the Lord.

All: We confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We turn from your Word and shrink from your will, and so we follow other gods. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy upon us. Forgive us, renew us, and let your light shine upon us, so that your will may be our delight, your ways the path we follow to the glory of your holy name. Amen.
