FROM PASTOR ED

Jesus' first prediction of his death and resurrection shocked and dismayed his disciples. They were, Jesus said, thinking of human things rather than divine things. They were imagining all of the great things Jesus would do, all of the changes he would make, all of the earthly glory, wealth and fame that would be his, and theirs as well. Jesus rebuked them and told them that if they want to be his followers, they must deny themselves, take up their cross and follow him.

Jesus' message is still shocking. He came to give his life so that all might live. He came to give his life so that his followers could give their lives too, and in giving their lives, save them. This theology of the

cross continues to challenge us while it continues to be the source of our salvation.

Welcome to Worship
