In our Gospel lesson this week, Jesus drives the merchants out of the Temple. The central holy place where people could come to be in God's presence had become a marketplace filling the worship area devoted to the common people so that they were unable to worship. Jesus' concern for "his father's house" and for God's people, becomes the source of conflict between Jesus and temple leaders, but it also becomes an opportunity for Jesus focus our worship, not on places or forms, but on our faith in him. In what ways are people hindered from worshiping God today? How can we become less concerned with the mechanics of worship and focus more on the God who loves us?

Welcome to Worship

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.
