I wish I could say I remember some special sermon that the pastor preached on Easter Sunday morning, but those unfortunately are lost to time. I pray that this Easter and Easter season fills you with the joy of that Easter promise, that you may have your faith refreshed by the overwhelming love of our God, and that you will make new Easter memories this year.

FINANCIAL NOTES:

- A. Current Financial Situation** – Kent's giving position for February 2024 was strong. Our actual expenses for February were back to a normal level after annual insurance premiums of \$12,000 were paid in full in January. Thank you to all those who prayerfully give offerings to support Kent's mission.
- B. Thrivent Designation** –Through Thrivent Choice[®], Thrivent members can contribute to organizations and causes they care about—and influence how Thrivent distributes some of its charitable grant funding through Choice Dollars[®]. Please consider going into your Thrivent account online and designating Kent as that organization.
- C. Thrivent Action Teams** – Thrivent provides \$250 per project to kick-start a fundraiser, educational event, or service project for Kent or the community. Each qualifying Thrivent member can submit two projects per year for approval by Thrivent. This is an excellent way to provide funds to do projects and not have to use Kent budgeted monies. - D. Schwab (previously TD Ameritrade) Account** - As you make distributions from your retirement 401Ks, 403Bs, IRAs or other investments, please visit with your financial planner/accountant about the possibility of transferring some of those funds to the Kent Schwab account or Kent checking account. The transfer might be able to be made with no capital gains tax consequence to you. If you have questions about this, please contact Gail Kruse or Al Mohling.
- E. Camden County Property Tax Freeze** – If you are 62 years of age or over, are the owner of a homestead in Camden County, and are liable for the payment of real property taxes on such homestead, you may qualify for the freeze. The amount of the taxes will freeze, and not increase, when the taxpayer becomes age 62. Only taxes will be frozen, not assessments or levees. For example, remodeling which expands square footage and results in a 50 percent increase in the assessment will trigger a reassessment of the property taxes. Individuals will need to apply annually (prior to June 30) at the Camden County Assessor, 50 Roofener Street, Camdenton to have their taxes frozen. Unapproved Minutes for March 19, 2024

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by President Jim Mellody

Dwelling in the Word: Al Mohling opened with devotion

Minutes- A motion to approve the February Council meeting minutes was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

Treasures Report- Al Mohling presented

Pastor's Report- Pastor Ed reported he has conducted four worship services, three Lenten services, and two Memorial/Celebration of Life services. He has had two home visits, one shut-in visit, one hospital visit and three counseling visits. He attended the meetings of Altar Guild, Christian Education, Endowment Committee, Finance Committee, Worship & Music and Congregation Council. He has attended the Men's Bible Study, Women's Bible study and Wednesday evening Bible Study. He has participated in Buddy Packs and WELCA. Pastor shared that it has been a busy month with early Lent and Easter. Pastor shared how important it is for people to hear thank you and that they are appreciated. He is very thankful for everyone that helps. He stated we are so blessed to have talented and willing people who make sure that we can share the Gospel with the world. It is one of the most important ways that we share Jesus with all.

Committee Reports- Budget & Finance- Al discussed which monies are considered to be "offering" and entered into PowerChurch to be reported on the annual giving and the monies given to various groups that are not a part of that process. Example being WELCA, poinsettias, bingo night, golf tournament. Al Mohling shared that Camden County is participating in a program that will allow people to freeze property tax. He will gather more information and it will be shared with all. Al Mohling made a motion to disburse up to \$2,000.00 from Thrivent Choice Dollars to both Social Ministry and the Buddy Pack program as requested or needed. Some suggestions were a dinner and movie, golf, bowling, Christmas concert or a show at Main Street Music Hall. They will be putting a label in the red books to remind people to PLEASE PRINT as it is sometimes hard to read otherwise. Social Ministry reported they still have needs and are possibly looking to do a fund raiser. Worship & Music reported they

have the details for Holy week planned. They are hosting Symphony of the Magic Dragon Monday, April 22 at 7 pm and Chorale Sunday, April 28 at 2pm. The red upholstered chairs will be sold at the rummage sale "as is". Endowment Committee is in the process of forming a Gift Policy. Property reported the Bob Ballard cleaned the Columbarium area. Sally Burke worked in the walking path flower bed. Bob Karls and Chuck Wanamaker dealt with some issues with the women's restroom toilets downstairs. Grief Support Group

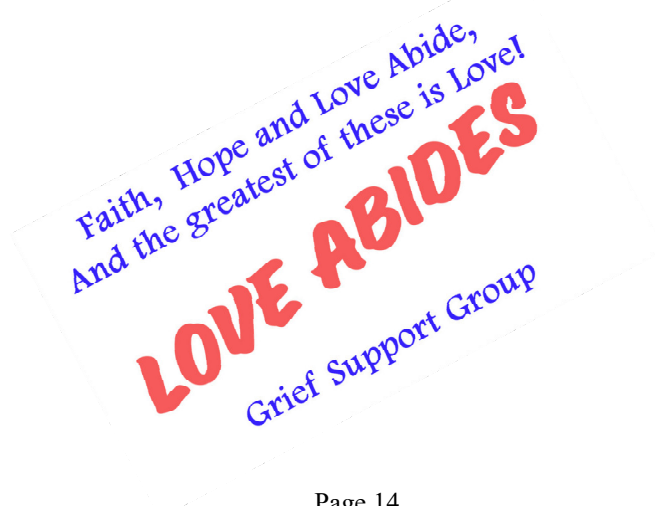
