**QUARTERS FOR QUALITY EDUCATION** Camdenton School District decided not to fund the Leader in Me program that Hurricane Deck uses for part of its curriculum. **CAMDEN COUNTY PROPERTY TAX FREEZE** If you are 62 years of age or over, are the owner of a homestead in Camden County, and are liable for the payment of real property taxes on such homestead, you may qualify for the freeze. The amount of the taxes will freeze, and not increase, when the taxpayer becomes age 62. Only taxes will be frozen, not assessments or levees. For example, remodeling which expands square footage and results in a 50 percent increase in the assessment will trigger a reassessment of the property taxes. Individuals will need to apply annually (prior to June 30) at the Camden County Assessor, 50 Roofener Street, Camdenton to have their taxes frozen.
