FROM PASTOR ED

Jesus wasn't always successful. In our lesson this week, Mark tells us that Jesus wasn't able to do any miracles in his own hometown because people there didn't believe. This doesn't mean that Jesus couldn't have done anything he wanted to, but it does mean that God involves us in God's work, far more than I suspect that we realize. Are we willing to be the people God will use to do God's work in the world? Do we realize how important our faith is? Are we ready to be a part of what God is doing in our world, in our community, in our families, in our lives?

Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it all must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them. When we are sent from the assembly to witness and to heal, we are asked to be vulnerable, to be dependent on the reception of others. The Spirit always operates in the "between": between Jesus and his Abba, between Jesus and us, between you and me, between us and those to whom we are sent.
