Called to Hospitality

Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Hebrews 13:1-2

As Abraham and Sarah were camped by the Oaks of Mamre three strangers came to visit, and Abraham and Sarah welcomed them with rest and refreshment. They showed hospitality to them. Only later would Abraham and Sarah would realize that those three strangers were actually God. From that moment on showing hospitality to strangers became a central part of Jewish identity. Who are we as the people of God? We are people who treat strangers as if they might be angels. We are the people who welcome everyone as if we were welcoming God.

To be sure, that was always more of an ideal than a reality. Human beings, by nature, tend to be fearful of strangers and standoffish to those who are outside their group. But the expectation was that as God's chosen people they would provide rest and sanctuary to everyone who came to them, and that coming into a Jewish community would truly be coming into the presence of God.

As disciples of Jesus that remains a part of our calling. Those who are in need, those who are hungry, those who are in danger, those who are alone and outcast should find welcome and hospitality among God's people.

That is surely true in congregations. Everyone who walks through the doors of a church should feel welcome and cared for. Whatever their background, whatever their age, race or situation in life, they should be treated with respect and even honor, as if they were angels, as if they were God himself.

I think Kent is particularly good at this. I hear so many people comment about how welcoming and warm our congregation is. Still, we would do well, I think, to consider our calling and how we can be even more hospitable? How can we be sure that people are comfortable here? How can we help them? How can we provide for them what they need, be that a place of rest, a place to be in God's presence, friendship, forgiveness, or food for their journey? For indeed, when we welcome strangers, we truly are welcoming angels. When we are hospitable we are entertaining God himself.

Unapproved Minutes for June 18, 2024

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by President Jim Mellody

Dwelling in the Word: Ruth Osterbur opened with devotion

Minutes- A motion to approve the May Council meeting minutes was made by Al Mohling, seconded by Wendy Blomberg, all approved.

Treasurer's Report- Gail Kruse presented

Pastor's Report- Pastor Ed reported he has conducted five worship services. He has had two shut-in visits, two hospital visits and one counseling visit. He attended the meetings of Altar Guild, Christian Education, Evangelism, Social Ministry, Worship & Music and Congregation Council. He has attended the Men's Bible Study the Women's Bible study and Wednesday evening Bible study. He has participated in Buddy Packs, Grief Support Group, WELCA, and Synod Deans Meeting. Pastor shared his privilege of baptizing the Lee children, the grandchildren of Bill Work and Jane Maher. The baptism was held at the lake, we welcome our new brothers and sister. Pastor shared information from the Synod Convention he attended stating it was a typical Synod convention. He felt the only potentially controversial actions were lowering of the Synod budget to match reduced funds and the passage of a resolution proclaiming, "this synod welcomes people of every race, background, age, political affiliation, economic and social status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, and mental and physical ability. The full version is available on the synod website or Pastor will provide a copy for you. We will be electing a new Bishop next year as Bishop Candea is planning to retire.

Committee Reports- Budget & Finance- Al Mohling reported they are working with QuickBooks on payroll deficiencies, they discussed Memorial fund and possibilities for some of those funds. -Property reported they have been mowing, weed killing, bracing up post in the outdoor worship area, replaced rope on the flagpoles, new flowers were placed in the columbarium area, fixed broken toilet seat and weeded flower beds. H & J construction has painted the stripping for the existing and new handicap parking spots. Marty and David Hansen have finished sealing the columbarium. David power washed the sidewalk behind the church. Roofmasters and a Church Mutual Insurance adjuster have checked for hail damage on the church, parsonage and buildings. They are waiting for the results. Thank you, Property for taking such good care of Kent and the property. -Stewardship reported they will focus on another of the prayers, one devoted to the proper use of wealth. -WELCA reported they have 17 families and 48 children signed up for the Buddy Pack program. The book club met to watch a video and discuss the book "Once Upon a Wardrobe". -Evangelism reported they had a card shower for the Keeney's 60th Anniversary. Root beer floats were

served for Father's Day. -Worship & Music reported Al Mohling will coordinate the Cruise Worship schedule, next cruise is July 10th at Captain Ron's. Fourth of July celebration will be bring your own non-alcoholic drinks and enjoy the show. Sally Burke had the most attendees at the Symphony of the Magic Dragon so the music department received \$100.00. They will be advertising for the bell choir director position. -Social Ministry reported they have paid out \$990.00 with mostly rent needs. The balance is \$3,730.00. The Bingo fundraiser will be September 6th. The Idiots Club received \$731.98 from the Darlene Mueller Memorial fund. Scholarship reported they have paid out one student and are waiting to hear from the others. -Endowment committee reported they are polishing up the Gift Acceptance policy. Dan Garrett is working on the amendment to our Continuing Resolutions to establish the Endowment committee. -Columbarium reported the area looks amazing! Adding the Charles Niemann memorial makes it look first class! Please read committee reports for full details.

Old Business- Council retreat is tabled. Discussion was held on the Kent Memorial Fellowship Hall policy. In regards to the Outside Groups and Organizations, the sentence reading "Decisions concerning use can be determined by the Church Council or if they will not meet before the proposed event, the Church Council President or designee" Steve Atzeni made a motion for the sentence to read "Decisions concerning use can be determined by the Church Council at a meeting or via e-mail. An "approved by" with date signature line will be added, along with Fee received by and date. Wendy Blomberg seconded the motion and all approved. Fees were reviewed and agreed they are good.

New Business- Council members going out are Bob Karls, Carol Hansen, Katherine Lacroix and Al Mohling. Council members are to find their own replacement if not returning.

Clowns will be disbanding; they have a balance of \$522.00 they recommend to the Buddy Pack Program. Michael Wagner made a motion for the monies to be dispersed to the Buddy Pack Program. Motion was seconded by Wendy Blomberg and all approved.
