Hearing God's Call & Responding in Love, We Share Jesus With All!

FROM PASTOR ED

Peter, do you love me? Three times Jesus asks Peter if he loves him, reminding everyone of the three times Peter denied Jesus on Good Friday. Three times Peter tells Jesus he does love him. And three times Jesus commands Peter to feed his sheep. Peter's salvation is complete, not just because he has affirmed his love for Christ, not even because he has been given the opportunity symbolically (and liturgically) repent of his sin. Peter's redemption is complete because his purpose and his mission is now defined, his love for Jesus will be made manifest in his care for Jesus' followers, by tending his lambs and feeding his

sheep. The risen and living Lord's call to follow him and to be a part of his mission is the sign by which we know that we have been accepted, forgiven and redeemed. We are now a part of the family, members of the kingdom, one of the team. Feed Jesus' sheep, care for his lambs, love him in both word and deed.

Confession and Forgiveness

- P: The Lord is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed!
- P: Jesus Christ was the first to conquer death, the ruler of all the kings of the earth.
- C: He loves us, and by his blood he sets us free from our sins.
